- -Title: "origins" "beginnings"
- -Purpose/Theme: The Founding of the Hebrew Nation
- -Authorship/Date: Moses, by 1405 BC (Ex. 17:14; 24:4; 34:27; Num. 33:2; Deut. 31:9, 24; Josh. 22:9; Judges 3:4; Matt. 19:8; Luke 5:14; Acts 3:22; Rom. 10:5)
- -Structure: "these are the generations of..." (2:4; 5:1; 6:9; 10:1; 11:10, 27; 25:12, 19; 36:1, 9; 37:2)

- -Part 1: Four Great Events: Creation (1, 2); Fall (4, 5); Flood (6-10); Dispersion (11)
- -Part 2: Four Great Men (Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph)
