- 7. Why is sorcery/witchcraft associated closely with adultery (v 3, Ma 3:5)?
- 8. How did the pagans treat God's righteous people? Why (v 4)?
- 9. Why does God call them "offspring of deceit" (v 4b, Je 10:14, Jn 8:39-47)?
- 10. Why did God not relent of His judgment (vv 5-6)?

- 1. Why do bad things happen to good people (v 1)?
- 2. Is it right, as a Christian, to want evil people to miss us when we're gone (He 11:38)?
- 3. Have you experienced the principle under point #2 (v 6b, Mt 5:13)?
