## Avoiding Hypocrisy Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18

## Main Point:

Knowing that your Father has given you a heavenly reward in Christ, practice righteousness to please Him alone and not man.

1. Jesus does not want you to practice righteousness for the praise of men.

2. Jesus wants you to practice righteousness to please your Father alone.

3. Your Father has given you your heavenly reward, not man.
