

Energies and Appetites That Drive


- Physical Drives the Body—Meekness controls these desires so they don't destroy us and our marriages.
- Emotional Drives the Passion and Feelings
 —meekness controls these desires so our
 feelings don't defeat us.
- Intellectual Drives the Mind—meekness controls these desires by setting our mind on the truth so our thinking doesn't distrect

Energies and Appetites that Drive

- Volitional Drives our Will—meekness controls these desires so that our choices are determined by truth so our decisions do not lead us astray.
- "When we choose the beginning of the way, we simultaneously choose the end of the way." Dr. Mac
- Satan blinds us to the end of the way by only looking at the beginning of the way.

Two Biblical Pictures of Meekness:

1. Trusting in the <u>Hard Circumstances</u> of <u>Life</u> (Psalm 37)

- What was David Facing? Wicked men who were:
 Slandering him (v.12).

 - Plotting to take his life (v. 14).
 Planning to steal his regal authority (vv. 12, 24).
 Prospering as they did so (vv. 7, 35).
- What was David to do?
 - Trust in the LORD, do good, feed on His faithfulness (v.3)
 Commit his ways to the LORD (v.5)

 - Rest in the LOŘD & wait patiently for Him (v.7)
 Cease from anger & wrath (v.8).

This is not Weakness. It is **Monumental Strength**.

Meekness is Deep Trust in the sovereignty, wisdom & power of Yahweh in the face of the hard



Two Biblical Pictures of Meekness:

- 2. Obeying the <u>Hard Mandates of Scripture</u> (Jas. 1:19-21)
- <u>Meekness</u> <u>in our Tongue</u> "swift to hear, slow to speak" (v. 19).
- <u>Meekness</u> <u>in</u> <u>our</u> <u>Temper</u> "slow to wrath" because it won't "produce . . . righteousness" (vv. 19-20).
- Meekness in our Temperament "receive with meekness the implanted word" (v. 21). It means:
 - Positively Welcome it with a teachable & humble spirit & submit to its authority obey it!
 - Negatively Refuse to argue against it, twist it to suit your fancy, or ignore it altogether.

We are to do this even when it **intersects** "what I want."



Meekness is God controlling the believer through His Spirit so that the believer can be a channel of God's power to build up lives not destroy them. Only the Holy Spirit can control and fill us this way. We cannot do it ourselves. This is why it takes discipline to learn to channel this energy through the Spirit and not the flesh.
