# "Getting Ready For Jesus" When Heaven Came To Prepare Earth For Salvation 

Luke 1:5-25

The ministry of the Messiah is organically related to the ministry of his Prophet - John the Baptist. Jesus regarded John as the greatest man who had ever lived (Luke 7:28). Luke also features the genesis and prophecy of this remarkable man. That's because in John's story we discover the aching $\qquad$ of the Jewish people and of our own human souls!
