  - Jesus increases the offense by speaking of a greater scandal. a.
    - 1) The greater scandal is his "ascension" which begins at the cross.—Phil. 2:8; John 3:14-15
    - The cross of Christ as the supreme scandal—I Cor. 1:23 2)
  - b. Jesus clarifies the nature of the metaphors He's been using—6:63
    - 1)
    - "Flesh profits nothing" "It is the Spirit who gives life" 2)
    - "The words I speak are spirit and...life" 3)
  - Jesus reveals that He knows who will believe-6:64-65 c.
