The old Proverb writer pondered a mystery: "the king's heart is a stream of water in the hand of the Lord; he turns it wherever he will" (Prov. 21:1). How does this happen? Today we see a stark example of God's eternal rule in the affairs of men, referred to as the "doctrine of ______" (see WC 3.1). That is, the human purposes of an Emperor "flow together" with and are directed by the eternal decrees of God. The great Octavian (r. 27 B.C. – A.D. 14) decreed in 8 B.C. that his Empire should be registered. His imperial bureaucracy followed, eventually propelling a young couple into David's royal city. And there – in fulfillment of all the ancient prophecies – was born a King whose Kingdom ("not of this world") would conquer the mighty Roman Empire.
