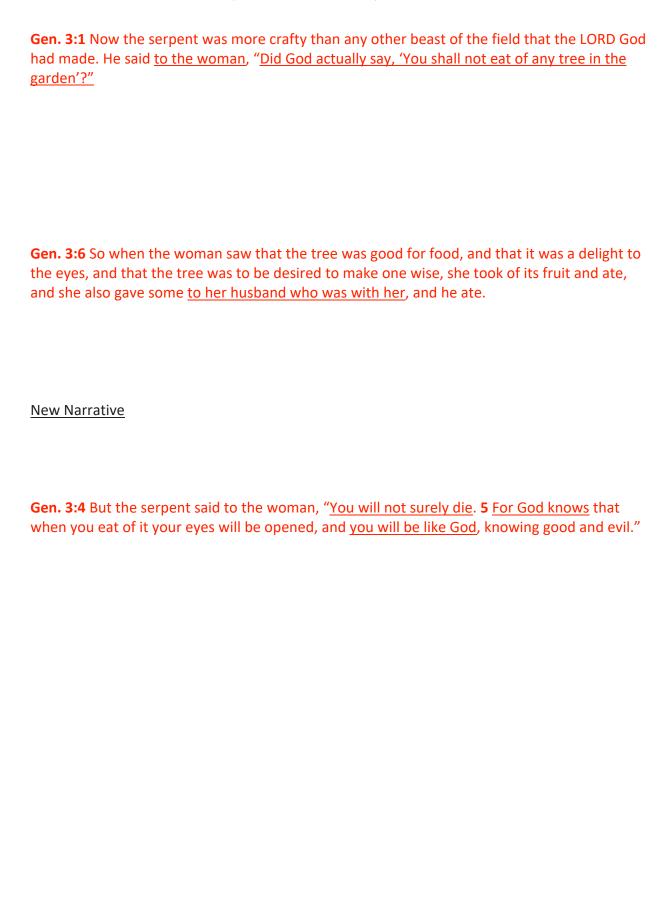

2 - God's Truthfulness Rejected

Gen. 3:6a So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a <u>delight to</u> the eyes, and that the tree was to be <u>desired to make one wise</u>,...

Eve was tempted in a 3-fold way:		

• Delight to the eyes

Good for food

• Desired to make one wise

Theologian John Goldingay wrote:

...there is a main question or problem: how did the man and the woman end up outside the garden that they were created to serve? The answer is that one of God's creatures asserts itself, and they yield to it instead of asserting authority over it. (John Goldingay, Genesis (Baker OT Commentary), p68)

Gen. 3:6b...<u>she took</u> of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was <u>with her</u>, and <u>he ate</u>.
