Gen. 3:1 Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, “Did God actually say, ‘You shall not eat of any tree in the garden’?”

Gen. 3:6 So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate.

New Narrative

Gen. 3:4 But the serpent said to the woman, “You will not surely die. 5 For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.”

2 - God's Truthfulness Rejected

Gen. 3:6a So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise,...

Eve was tempted in a 3-fold way:

- Good for food
- Delight to the eyes
- Desired to make one wise

Theologian John Goldingay wrote:

...there is a main question or problem: how did the man and the woman end up outside the garden that they were created to serve? The answer is that one of God's creatures asserts itself, and they yield to it instead of asserting authority over it. (John Goldingay, Genesis (Baker OT Commentary), p68)

Gen. 3:6b...she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate.

Listening to the Wrong Voice

Gen. 3:17 And to Adam he said, “Because you have listened to the voice of your wife and have eaten of the tree of which I commanded you, ‘You shall not eat of it,’ cursed is the ground because of you; in pain you shall eat of it all the days of your life;

Gen. 3:7 Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked. And they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loincloths.
