I. <u>Properly defining biblical holiness.</u>

(A) It is of vital importance.

➤ If you get it wrong, or become indifferent to the command to pursue it, you are placing yourself in a very precarious position.

(B) <u>Defining it can be dangerous.</u>

➤ Wrong definitions, concepts, and ideas of Biblical holiness (a) has started many cults (b) has held many people in spiritual bondage (c) has crippled many churches through religious pride and judgementalism of others.

II. <u>Mistaken definitions, concepts of holiness.</u>

(A) Theological, or Doctrinal

- 1. **Christian Mysticism** "Christian mysticism is the tradition of mystical practices and mystical theology within Christianity which "concerns the preparation [of the person] for, the consciousness of, and the effect of [...] a direct and transformative presence of God"
 - (a) Voluntarism (Thomas à Kempis)
 - (b) Quietism (Miguel de Molinos)
 - (c) Eastern Spirituality (Macarious of Egypt)
- 2. Protestant 'Sinless Perfectionism', or 'Complete Sanctification'.
 - (d) John Wesley
- 3. Protestant 'Antinomianism' or 'Hyper-Grace'
 - (e) Johannes Agricola

(B) <u>Practical</u>, or Applicatory

➤ One of the most damaging results to the true pursuit of biblical holiness is not properly defining what it is and then substituting it with our own tradition or definition.

<u>Horatius Bonar</u> "Biblical Holiness is not an external thing we do or don't; do...it is not made up of showy moralities or acts of goodness, or picturesque ceremonies and graceful routines of devotions, nor is it emotional sentimentalisms no matter how bright or somber, nor is it religious utterances on fitting occasions...It is something deeper, something truer, and more marked, than that which is called deep, and true in modern religious philosophical terms..."
