Introduction

- 1. When a child is born to believing parents, it is a requirement of God that this child be baptized.
- 2. Why must we baptize our children?
- 3. Baptism is the sign of the covenant that teaches us that God sovereignly saves.

The Important Question

- 1. The question, "Why are infants also to be baptized?" is important.
 - a. There are those who make infant baptism a matter of preference.
 - b. There are others who deny infant baptism.
- 2. There are those who believe in infant baptism, but practice it for the wrong reasons.

The Covenantal Basis

- 1. There is one covenant of God and one covenant people of God and the children of believers are included in the covenant of God.
 - a. God's covenant is the relationship of friendship that He establishes with His people in Jesus Christ.
 - b. Therefore, we must understand there is one covenant of God and one covenant people.
 - c. Proof that children born to believers "are included in the covenant and church of God." (A. 74)
- 2. On the basis that there is only one covenant of God it follows there is only one sign of the covenant.
 - a. God gave Abraham the sign of circumcision in connection with the establishment of the covenant. Genesis 17:11
 - b. Scripture teaches that baptism in the New Testament has the same significance as circumcision in the Old Testament.

The Practical Significance

- 1. We must view our children according to what God says in His Word.
- 2. Therefore, they need to be instructed.
