**From God's Mouth to Our Ears**

Moses is God's undisputed premier spokesman on earth up to the time of Jesus. The communication between God and Moses was face to face and intense. Moses' calling was to pass on precisely what God told him – he would be the quintessential prophet. As with all true prophets there could be no tempering of God's words and no tampering with God's message. By God's grace Moses was faithful to that task. This great prophet of God was not only sent to speak to God's people and to the Egyptians of his day, he was also tasked with composing the first five books of God's Holy Word otherwise (known as the Pentateuch) so generations to come would have God's Word as well. Moses played a key role in the history of redemption, yet he knew himself that he, (like all mankind) desperately needed a Redeemer. It should be not surprise to us then that so much of what Moses wrote, the signs and wonders he was sent to do, and the vision he had for things to come focused on Messiah Jesus – so much so that Jesus was prompted to say: For if you believed Moses, you would believe me; for he wrote of me.
