Morning Service: Genesis 17:7-8; Acts 2:37-41; Galatians 3:23-29

Baptism – Obeying and Receiving

- 1. God's Covenant Is to Be Our God and Make Us His People.
- 2. How Do We Baptize?
- 3. Jesus Completed What Baptism Symbolizes and Seals.

The history of God's redemption of His people is a long love story of His faithfulness despite all our rebellion to restore us to Himself. He has used a visible sign and seal (sacrament) all along to mark out His people as peculiarly His own. Baptism is now that identifying reality that we obey God in doing (and applying to our children) and receiving from God Himself.

Taking Gathered Worship Home

God commanded Abraham to be circumcised together with all those in his house. Jesus transformed that sign and seal of purification to being cleansed with living water in baptism for all believers and their children. Baptism is that signal way of declaring publically and officially "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord!"

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to meet with Jesus. Ask Christ to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

Sunday AM

READ Genesis 17:7-8; Acts 2:37-41; Galatians 3:23-29. DISCUSS, for whom was the covenant/promise intended? What were recipients of this covenant to do as a result? How does baptism point to Christ? How does it seal us as God's people? PRAY rejoice for the new members God has provided for FCCW.

Sunday PM

READ Acts 8: 26 - 40. DISCUSS, How do reflect on your own Baptism? How has this discussion helped you to understand Baptism as a sacrament?

Monday

READ **Genesis 17:7-8**. DISCUSS, What are the similarities of God's call to Abraham and to people today? What are some differences? How did it involve his whole family? How about ours? PRAISE God for His kindness to us in the gospel. BEFRIEND someone in your neighborhood or workplace.

Tuesday

READ Acts 2:37-41. DISCUSS, How does the gospel proclamation build on what had gone before them as sons of Abraham? By what were they cut to the heart? How do both circumcision and baptism point to our need for Jesus? How do they point to His redemption for us? PRAY, "Lord, forgive us for taking baptism for granted. Teach us to walk in the newness of life signified and sealed in our baptism into Christ."

Wednesday

READ Genesis 17:7-8; Colossians 2:11-15. DISCUSS, How has the covenant remained the same? In what ways has it been expanded? What does it mean for you to live in the reality of your baptism? If you have not been baptized, why not? PRAY, Ask God to help us understand His mark of being in His family.

Thursday

READ the accounts of "household baptisms" in **Acts 16:11-15**; **29-34**; **18:8**. DISCUSS, How does this fit with the model of God's receiving circumcision? Why? PRAY, "Jesus, empower us to proclaim Your truth to our families in Your power."

Friday

READ Genesis 17:7-8; Acts 2:37-41; Galatians 3:23-29. DISCUSS, What have you been learning this week about baptism? How are you applying your own baptism (if baptized)? If you have not been baptized, why not? PRAY thanking the Lord for the gift of His signs and seals of the covenant He has made with us. Thank Christ for fulfilling it.

Saturday

PREPARE today for the gathered worship service tomorrow and **communion** together with God and His covenant people.

READ Matt 28:16-20; Acts 16:11-15; 29-34; 19:1-5. Come to worship tomorrow asking the Holy Spirit to guide us together as a congregation. Pray for our neighbors to know this joy.
