- 2. Read Matthew 21:12-16. How does Jesus use the words of this psalm to show the praise of God?
  - a. How does using the words of children stop God's enemies?
  - b. Can you give an example of this today? (In addition, read 1 Corinthians 1:18-31.)
- 3. Read again verses 3-4.
  - a. Have you ever lain on the ground at night looking at the stars? (I recommend this at least once in someone's life.) If so, what was your observation?
  - b. What gives man his worth?
  - c. Why is pride such an affront to God?
- 4. The great debate on this psalm is if the psalmist is referring to man(kind) in general or specifically to Jesus. What do you think?
  - a. Read Genesis 1-2. How does Psalm 8 tie into the Biblical account of creation? How did mankind mess up the creation mandate of dominion?
  - b. Read Hebrews 2:5-10. How does the author of Hebrews apply Psalm 8 to Jesus?
  - c. Could the author be referring to both?
- 5. How does this psalm give to us both reasons for humility and reasons for self-worth? What does it say about our role in creation? Who is the psalm addressed to throughout it?
