CONCLUSION:

- 1. We have the responsibility to encourage one another to good works **Heb** 10:23-24
- 2. We are debtors of Grace, required to pay back with Grace Mt 10:8
- 3. Good works have the reward of Grace

Pr 19:17 He who is gracious to a poor man **lends** to the LORD, And He will repay him for his good deed.

That is an amazing statement about God's Grace! He will reward us, for His own work in us. Man, what a motivation to passionately pursue good works, "so that men may see them, and glorify our Father who is in heaven"

The Priority of the Glory of God #9 In our good works (2)

Introduction: thesis - a true disciple of Christ, will be inevitably engaged in good works.

Review: from the passage in Mt. 5:13-16 we looked at

- The Christian's <u>Identification</u> as Salt and light
- The Christian's <u>Mission</u> to preserve / prevent from corruption and to illumine the path to righteousness
- I Good works must be Deliberate
- II Good works must be Tangible
- III Good works must have one single purpose"So that they may glorify your Father in heaven"

This morning we will answer two questions about good works and the thesis that a disciple of Christ must be inevitably engaged in them. **Why?** & **What are those good works?**

Text: Ephesians 2:10 For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.

- 1. God's workmanship Der. Poem
 - a. God's craftsmanship This has nothing to do with natural abilities or inclinations. I Co 4:7
 - b. <u>Created in Christ Jesus</u>: "in" points to the new creation in Christ. 2 Co 5:17. and to our union with Christ
 - c. <u>This results in Evangelical Obedience</u>: not to merit salvation but to display God's work in us. Illustration **Zaccheus Lk 19:8-9**
- 2. Created with a purpose: For good works Is 43:7 comp Mt. 5:19
- 3. For good works that God prepared beforehand
- a. Good works are Ineludible: they were prepared before hand Pro + Hetoimazo: to "level the road and make it passable before the coming of a king"
- b. Good works bear the moral excellence of their author:

c. This text presents the <u>balanced tension</u> between *God's* Sovereignty and Man's Responsibility.

Wrap-up: Good works are <u>ineludible</u>. God prepared them beforehand! Comp. **Tit 2:11-14** & **Tit 3:8** This is a trustworthy statement; and concerning these things I want you to speak confidently, so that those who have believed God may be careful to engage in good deeds.

Transition: from the "why" to the "What": Our problem as Evangelical Christians does not lie in <u>understanding</u> the doctrine of good works in its theological context, but in <u>engaging</u> in good works.

That's why the second question I want to answer is:

II - What are these "good works"?

- a) Good works are those that alleviate the pain or enhance the comfort & joy of others Jn 10:32 Ex: The Lord Jesus
- b) Good works are directed to meet material needs Acts 9:36-ff
- Dorcas' deeds were wrapped in <u>charity</u> and <u>kindness</u>.
- Dorcas' good works favored those who were <u>nearest her.</u> Illust.: Elijah in Zarepta.
- Dorcas' good works were done <u>continually</u>.
- They were done according to <u>Dorcas' abilities and gifts</u>
 She did what she could, with what she knew... she sowed tunics
- Dorcas' good works were tangible and outlived her.
- c) Good works are those that provide relief and refreshment I Ti 5:9-10 Ex: the godly widows at the church in Ephesus
- Their good works were <u>exercised in the context of her domestic duties</u>. Comp Tit 2:5
- They were known for their devotion to good works
- Are good works an important facet of the church life? Comp. Tit 3:14 And let
 our people also learn to engage in good deeds to meet pressing needs, that they may not
 be unfruitful.
- d) Good works imply sharing generously from our possessions I Ti 6:17-19
