Chapter 12 in the Gospel of John marks a turning point.
Prior to Chapter 12:

- John 2:4 And Jesus said to her [his mother], "Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come."
- John 6:15 Perceiving then that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, Jesus withdrew again to the mountain by himself.
- John 7:6 Jesus said to them [his brothers], "My time has not yet come...
- John 7:30 So they were seeking to arrest him, but no one laid a hand on him, because his hour had not yet come.
- John 10:39 Again they sought to arrest him, but he escaped from their hands.
In Chapter 12:
- Jesus presents himself as the promised M essiah (v 12-19).
- Jesus declares his hour has come (v23).

- A nationalist Messiah that would deliver them from Roman oppression
- Waiving of palm braches
- Hosanna!
- Similar to what occurred after feeding of the 5,000:

John 6:15 Perceiving then that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, Jesus withdrew again to the mountain by himself
