- A. **Priority** "thou shalt also make a table"
- B. Plushness "make there a crown of gold round about"
- C. Practicality "make to it a border of a hand breath"

II. Picturesque - "thou shalt set…before me alway" (vs. 26- 30) *Displaying the beauty of:*

- A. Function "the staves to bear the table"
- **B.** Form "of pure gold shalt thou make them"
- C. Favor "thou shalt set upon the table...before me"

III. Perpetual - "made by fire by a perpetual statue"(Lev. 24:5-9) *Desiring our :*

- A. Purity "I will meet with thee...above the mercy seat"
- B. Prayer "I will commune with thee"
- C. Piety "thou...put the testimony I shall give thee"
