ORDER OF WORSHIP

Thank you for joining us this morning! At Christ the King, our worship is a divine-human dialogue, in accordance with Scriptural example and precedent, alternatively hearing God's Word and responding in prayer, song, or meditation. The gray boxes throughout the bulletin were written to aid each worshipper in thoughtful and meaningful participation in this dialogue. Please prepare your heart by reading through the bulletin, praying for those leading and worshipping around you, and silencing all communication devices.

We encourage parents to involve children as soon as possible in the worship service. In consideration of other worshippers, we request parents with children not yet ready for unobtrusive participation in worship to utilize the nursery or, if necessary, the cry room. A nursery is available for children ages 3 months to 3 years during all Sunday morning activities.

Prelude

Call to Worship

As we are called to worship today we are reminded that all those who seek the Lord are to rejoice. That is because He has promised that "You will seek me and find me, when you seek me with all your heart" (Jeremiah 29:13). We are then exhorted to seek the Lord continually. Let us therefore approach our worship with this attitude: that we are seeking nothing but God Himself, and that is enough.

Psalm 105:1-4 ESV

I Oh give thanks to the LORD; call upon his name;
make known his deeds among the peoples!
² Sing to him, sing praises to him;
tell of all his wondrous works!
₃ Glory in his holy name;
let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice!
Seek the LORD and his strength;
seek his presence continually!

Prayer of Adoration and Invocation

* Hymn of Praise

One of the ways that we seek God is to pray and ask for His presence. So our opening hymn of praise does just that, repeatedly asking God to "come" and give us what we need to praise Him acceptably.

* Reading from the Law

It is important to note that this passage presents obedience to the commandments of God as the proper response to the electing grace of redemption already given to his people, not (in this context) as a pretext for understanding our need for redemption. This means that it is not sinless perfection that is being commanded here, but a general life of loving, grateful, obedient response to His covenant faithfulness and grace. The heart of it, we should note, is that we take on His character and mirror His righteousness.

Deuteronomy 10:12-22 ESV

12 "And now, Israel, what does the LORD your God require of you, but to fear the LORD your God, to walk in all his ways, to love him, to serve the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul, 13 and to keep the commandments and statutes of the LORD, which I am commanding you today for your good? 14 Behold, to the LORD your God belong heaven and the heaven of heavens, the earth with all that is in it. 15 Yet the LORD set his heart in love on your fathers and chose their offspring after them, you above all peoples, as you are this day. 16 Circumcise therefore the foreskin of your heart, and be no longer stubborn. 17 For the LORD your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great, the mighty, and the awesome God, who is not partial and takes no bribe. 18 He executes justice for the fatherless and the widow, and loves the sojourner, giving him food and clothing. 19 Love the sojourner, therefore, for you were sojourners in the land of Egypt. 20 You shall fear the LORD your God. You shall serve him and hold fast to him, and by his name you shall swear. 21 He is your praise. He is your God, who has done for you these great and terrifying things that your eyes have seen. 22 Your fathers went down to Egypt seventy persons, and now the LORD your God has made you as numerous as the stars of heaven.

Silent Confession of Sin

Corporate Confession of Sin

Notice that in this, as in many of our confessions, we pray for God not only to forgive us for our failure to obey His law, but also to give us the grace we need actually to obey and live holy and righteous lives.

Lord God! Eternal and Almighty Father, we acknowledge and confess before Your holy Majesty that we are poor sinners, conceived and born in guilt and in corruption, prone to do evil, unable of ourselves to do any good, who, by reason of our depravity, transgress without end Your holy commandments. Therefore, we have drawn upon ourselves, by Your just sentence, condemnation and death. But, Oh Lord! With heartfelt sorrow, we repent and deplore our offenses. We condemn ourselves and our evil ways, with true repentance beseeching that Your grace may relieve our distress.

Be pleased to have compassion on us, O most gracious God, Father of all mercies, for the sake of Your Son Jesus Christ our Lord.And in removing our guilt and our pollution, grant us the daily increase of the grace of Your Holy Spirit, that acknowledging from our inmost heart our own unrighteousness, we may be touched with sorrow that shall work true repentance, and that Your Spirit, mortifying all sin within us, may produce the fruits of holiness and righteousness well pleasing in Your sight.Through Jesus Christ our Lord.Amen.

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

According to John, one of the ways we have assurance of our secure relationship with God, in spite of our sin and the consequent accusation of our hearts, is observing the fruit of our faith: a life of obedience to God's commands, the heart of which is love to our neighbors, especially our brothers and sisters in Christ. This is not salvation by works or legalism, but the evidence and expression of the faith through which we are saved by the grace of Christ. The essence of that salvation is that we not only are forgiven and not guilty, but also are enabled actually to live lives of obedience, putting to death our sin. To be saved is to be saved from sin in all of its effects.

I John 3:16-24 ESV

16 By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers. 17 But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? 18 Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth.

19 By this we shall know that we are of the truth and reassure our heart before him; 20 for whenever our heart condemns us, God is greater than our heart, and he knows everything. 21 Beloved, if our heart does not condemn us, we have confidence before God; 22 and whatever we ask we receive from him, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him. 23 And this is his commandment, that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. 24 Whoever keeps his commandments abides in God, and God in him. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit whom he has given us.

* Hymn of Assurance

It is Jesus' work, and Jesus' work alone, which delivers us from our guilt before God. But realizing that is the very thing that, for the first time, enables us to obey God from the heart. We celebrate that great truth now as we sing this insightful hymn.

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.
