• Universal call to the disciplemaking ministry

Introduction:

- Why are people afraid to say the word Disciple and Disciplemaker?
- Why is the word "mentor" used which is a secular term?
- Mentor is a passive relationship it occurs in the pagan writings of Homor the Greek Goddess of Athena was the first use of the word as was the character Mentor

in Homor's pagan writings. It appears again in French secular literature in the 17th Century. Here it is adapted from pagan Greek writings to mean "someone who imparts wisdom to and shares knowledge with a less-experienced colleague"

- Disciplemaking by contrast is a proactive relationship which entails more than just wisdom, but also training, discipline and accountability.
- The same Greek word is found in these three passages...

Luke 6:40 NKJ

40 A <u>disciple</u> is not above his teacher, but everyone who is perfectly trained will be like his teacher.

Luke 14:26-27 NASU

26 " If anyone comes to Me, and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be My <u>disciple</u>. 27 "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after Me cannot be My disciple.

• Do not be afraid or be intimidated about using Scriptural words.

Make Disciples

Christ commanded that we make disciples

Matthew 28:19-20

19 " Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

• In keeping with the command of Jesus in the Great Commission making disciples was inseparable from the written Word of God

Acts 6:7

7 The word of God kept on spreading;

and the number of the disciples continued to increase greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were becoming obedient to the faith. (Romans 1:5; 16:26)

• The early church earnestly sought to obey this command, passing on the exhortation of Jesus in *John 15:18-20*

Acts 14:21-22

21 After they had preached the gospel to that city and had <u>made many</u> <u>disciples</u>, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch, 22 strengthening <u>the souls of the disciples</u>, encouraging them to continue <u>in the faith</u>, and saying, "Through <u>many tribulations</u> we must enter the kingdom of God."

Acts 6:1

Christians were initially called Disciples

Acts 11:26

26 and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. And for an entire year they met with the church and <u>taught considerable numbers</u>; and the disciples were first called Christians in Antioch.

And having spent some time there, he left and passed successively through the Galatian region and Phrygia, <u>strengthening all the disciples</u>
