- A. A tale of two kings A poor and wise youth ... An old and foolish king
  - **1)** Introducing the characters
    - a) A poor and wise youth
    - **b)** An old and foolish king
    - c) Occassion for writing this
      - i. Considering Solomon (1 Kgs 3:7-9)
      - ii. Considering Christ
  - 2) One is better than the other (Psalm 37:16-17)
  - 3) The lesson is clear: walk in wisdom (Eccl 12:1-14)
- **B.** The blessing of wisdom
  - 1) A case extraordinary The life of Joseph
  - 2) A case redemptive Christ's humiliation and exaltation
  - **3)** The case ordinary, in our union with Christ (Rom 6:4-9a; Psa 113:7-8)
- C. The great characteristic of folly who will be admonished no more
  - 1) This is not the cause, but the characteristic, of foolishness.
  - **2)** Other sins which are associated with this hard-heartedness and hard-headedness:
    - a) Self-Indulgence (1 Tim 5:6);
    - **b)** Pride (Pr 14:12);
    - c) Self-Sufficiency (Isa 9:8-11)
- **D.** The way of wisdom shown by its shadow
  - 1) We must take counsel, and receive admonition
    - a) In Principle
      - **i.** The Quantity of Counsel:
        - Do not overwhelm yourself with counsel
        - Do not neglect pursuing counsel
      - ii. The Quality of Counsel (1 Kgs 12:1-11)
        - Do not take poor counsel: what makes poor counsel?
          - \* Poor counselors
          - \* Counsel which encourages the asserting of oneself
          - \* Counsel which encourages the serving of oneself

- \* Counsel which discourages self-examination
- \* Counsel which neglects the life and law of Christ
- \* Counsel which neglects the actual and root issue at hand
- Take wise counsel from wise counsellors
- **b)** In Practice
  - i. Heed the Preaching of God's Word (Lk 16:19-21; 1 Thes 2:13)
  - ii. Heed your Pastors/Elders/Deacons
  - **iii.** In the Family (1 Cor 14:34-45; Eph 6:1-3)
  - iv. Trusted friends
  - v. Generally, those whom Providence has placed life.
- 2) Three further warnings no more
  - **a)** It is not enough to passively wait for counsel.
  - **b)** It is not enough to hear counsel; you must do it.
  - c) It is not enough to merely begin in the way; you must finish in the way (Pr 28:13).

- **B.** Observations on the Vanity of Wisdom:
  - **1)** Just because something will not last, does not mean that it is not good.
  - 2) Just because something will not last, does not mean that it is not commanded.
  - 3) Total depravity does not cease with covenant kids.
  - 4) Common sense does not overrule total depravity.
  - 5) All things under the sun are, in some sense, vain.
- C. Applications concerning the vanity of wisdom
  - **1)** The fragility of families.
  - **2)** The fragility of churches.
  - **3)** The need for humility.
  - 4) The joy of godliness, even in the midst of vanity.
  - **5)** The need for prayer (Ex 20:5-6)
