## **Application Questions**

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

- 1. Read **Psalm 139:23-24**. How would you explain to a new Christian the work of becoming increasingly aware of one's motives? How would you go about helping him be more honest with God about why he does what he does?
- 2. Read 1 Timothy 6:3-10 and Matthew 6:24. Why does it make sense that a life driven by desires to secure more riches and material wealth will never be truly useful to advance the spiritual growth and maturity of God's people?
- 3. Read **Romans 1:28-29**. Define "covetousness" (see Exodus 20:17). Why do you think God included this particular sin in the Romans' list of what is described as a "debased" mind? Why is it such a big deal?
- 4. Read **1 Corinthians 15:10**. How does Paul's work ethic, in his tentmaking job and in all his ministries, motivate you to make sure "God's grace" toward you is "not in vain?"
- 5. Read **2 Corinthians 8:9**. How would you grade the state of your generosity? What can you do to imitate more of Christ's excelling generosity for the good of his people?
