Ruined by Religion

Religious rituals can take us far from God. V.1-24

- 1) When religion equals **<u>rule keeping</u>** we become **<u>pitiless</u>** (14:1-6). Notice:
 - a) <u>Manipulation</u> "there was a certain man before Him who had dropsy." (v.2).
 - b) **Entrapmen**t "they watched Him closely..." (v.1).
 - c) **Incorrigibility** "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?" (v.3).
 - d) <u>Hypocrisy</u> Which one of you won't save an animal that falls in a pit on the Sabbath? (v.5).
- 2) When religion becomes *ritualistic* we become *proud*. (7-14).
 - a) Participants beware of pride: v.8-11 (Those invited)
 - i) Pride seeks **power, position and prominence** in front of men.
 - ii) Humility will be **honored**.
 - iii) Even the <u>"elect"</u> can be full of pride.
 - b) Hosts beware of Pride v.12-14 (Those inviting)
 - i) Proud people consider the <u>status</u> of the people with whom they associate.
 - ii) Proud people only look for relationships that can **reciprocate**. (v.14)
- 3) When religion becomes a *routine* we become *presumptuous* (v.15-24)
 - a) It is presumptuous to think you need no **<u>repentance</u>**.
 - b) It is presumptuous to think matters <u>on earth</u> are more important than the matter <u>of eternity</u>.
 - c) It is presumptuous to assume you have **plenty of time**.

<u>Religion</u> won't save you.

Religious **<u>rituals</u>** do not lead to repentance rather to pride Religious **<u>routine</u>** can lull you to sleep spiritually and give you false hope. We are invited to the kingdom but we must **<u>respond</u>** to the invitation.
