Luke 10:25-37 OT: 1 Kings 17:8-16

**Theme:** We will never inherit eternal life by keeping the law. But the blessing of eternal life is made evident in our obedience to the law of love.

**Background:** Turning point in the gospel.

- Luke 4 9:50 Galilean ministry miracles/compassion
- Road to Jerusalem teaching and parables - Luke 9:51-19:44
- Rising opposition against Jesus

**Introduction:** *Christian life from the balcony – or in the street??* 

## I. The *Right* Question (25-28)

- A. The "Expert" questions Jesus
  - 1. Context? (v.21)
  - 2. An excellent question
    - No better, more important one to ask
  - 3. Mixed motives?
    - a. "Put him to the test"
    - b. A preconceived idea
- B. Jesus asks the "Expert"
  - 1. Let him answer first
    - a. "What is written?"
    - b. The Great Commandment
      - Answers with the "Shema" (Deuteronomy 6:5)
      - And the Law (Leviticus 19:18)
  - 2. Trapped in his answer
    - a. "Do this, and you will live."
    - b. No one can do it. (Galatians 3:10)

NOTE: Now the law is doing its work! It shows us the need for atonement.

# **II.** The *Wrong* Question (29-35)

- A. Who is my neighbor?
  - Looking for the escape clause! (Leviticus 19:18; 19:34-35)
  - The heart of the matter

#### **II.** The *Wrong* Question (cont.)

- B. A memorable (and compelling) response!
  - 1. A "man" on the road
  - 2. The "righteous" pass by!
    - Can you list the excuses??
  - 3. The *Samaritan*??
    - a. The Ancient Enemy

NOTE: Jesus is challenging everything in which this man is trusting!!

- b. A real neighbor!
  - true compassion
  - indiscriminate care (Jew or Samaritan?)
  - personal involvement
  - meets every need
  - provides till he returns

NOTE: Jesus describes himself in His work and ministry through this parable.

## **III.** A New Perspective

- A. Who is the neighbor?
  - Not "Who is **my** neighbor?"
  - But "Who is *the* neighbor?"
- B. Reluctant understanding
  - Real acceptance??

#### IV. Doing "Likewise

- A. The constraint
  - Salvation, eternal life cannot be earned.
  - Loving God, and loving neighbor is not a matter of the law, but of the heart!!

NOTE: We must first see ourselves as the man left in the road, completely helpless on our own. Otherwise we may trust in those "good works" as the way of salvation.

- Eternal life is only in Christ.
- B. The inconvenience (Alternate Title: Love's Inconvenience)
  - Living on His timetable
  - How good are your excuses?
- C. The command
  - "You go, and do likewise."
  - Are you down in the street, or sitting in the balcony?
