"GODLY LEADERS ARE LEARNERS"

- I. A GODLY LEADER MUST KNOW GOD AND LOVE HIM COMPLETELY
 - A. Jesus, our example, intentionally and intently learned and loved God, His Father
 - B. God wants to be known and makes it clear that it is the most <u>important</u> thing a man can do
 - C. <u>Eternal</u> life is knowing God and Jesus Christ whom He sent
 - D. Loving God with our <u>whole</u> <u>being</u> is the greatest command in the cosmos
- II. A GODLY LEADER MUST BE COMMITTED TO LEARNING WHAT GOD SAID AND DEVELOP A BIBLICAL WORLD VIEW
 - A. The Bible is the Word of God
 - B. Our Lord was intent on knowing the Word of God
 - C. Learning is not simply memorizing the words
 - D. Learning includes memorizing the words and meditating on them
 - E. Learning means letting those words <u>transform</u> the way you think

- F. Learning is <u>doing</u> or it isn't learning
- G. Learning is testing the <u>world</u> by the <u>Word</u> not testing the <u>Word</u> by the <u>world</u>
- H. Maturity is knowing what not to learn
- III. A GODLY LEADER MUST KNOW AND LOVE HIS FLOCK Proverbs 27:23-27; John 10:10-29
 - A. Jesus loved His flock and looked to find them; the godly leader learns which sheep are his
 - B. The godly leader learns what is <u>dangerous</u> to his flock and what is <u>good</u> for the flock based on his learning the Word of God and dependence on the Holy Spirit given to him
 - C. The godly leader must learn his sheep's ways
 - D. The godly leader must spend <u>time</u> with his sheep to know them and give of his life to them (provide, protect, lead)
- IV. A GODLY LEADER MUST KNOW AND LIVE HIS PURPOSE INTENTLY
 - A. The church is tasked with a <u>common</u> purpose; this must be learned and held with conviction
 - B. The godly leader learns how his <u>individual</u> purpose aligns with the <u>common</u> purpose
 - C. He learns through obedient experience
