A Blessed Network

We can sometimes imagine in our minds that Paul was a very independent, self-sufficient individual, but that could not be further from the truth. First, Paul was utterly dependent upon the Lord to sustain and keep Him – that may be obvious. But it becomes clear when reading the Book of Acts and his epistles that he also relied heavily on the support of faithful believers. Everywhere he went he sought a trusted network of saints to share in his Kingdom work. Here, at the close of the letter to the Colossians, Paul commends numerous individuals to the church. In his final greeting he mentions many names adding positive comments about their ministry or their character. Paul serves as a good reminder to us that we are not only to be encouraging and supportive of other saints, but that we must not be too proud to rely on the ministry and prayers of others as we serve together in the Lord's work.

As we close out this series of sermons from Colossians, we should reflect back on what we have learned and be sure we are applying it to our lives. Paul was confident that what he was given to write was from the Lord – so much so that he wants to make sure it is read to other believers as well. What a blessing that this little letter, preserved in God's Word, has been used to edify churches, inspire believers, and convict sinners in countless ways ever since it was composed and sent out so long ago.
