- I. Because of the objective reality of the gospel
 - A. Premise: the reality of the gospel
 - B. Encouragement in Christ (Romans 12:1; 15:30; 16:7; 1 Corinthians 1:10)
 - C. Comfort from love
 - D. Participation in the Spirit
 - E. Affection and sympathy (Philippians 1:8; see also Exodus 34:6; Psalm 25:6; 86:15; Romans 12:1; 2 Corinthians 1:3
- II. We are called to unified pursuit of the progress of the gospel
 - A. Paul's personal appeal: "Complete my joy!"
 - B. By being of the same mind
 - C. Having the same love (see Philippians 1:9)
 - D. Being in full accord and of one mind
 - E. The goal of the church: progress of the gospel (Philippians 1:5, 7, 12, 14-18, 27)
- III. The kind of thinking that leads to unity
 - A. Do nothing (literally just *nothing!* out of rivalry or conceit)
 - B. Nothing from self-seeking motives!
 - C. Nothing from pretentiousness!
 - D. Instead: Humility (see Isaiah 5:15; Zephaniah 2:3; 2 Samuel 22:28; Psalm 10:17; 25:18; Ephesians 4:2; 1 Peter 5:5; Colossians 3:12)
 - E. Counting others more significant than yourselves
- IV. The kind of action that leads to unity
 - A. Don't just look out for yourself
 - B. Look out for the interests of others
- V. Unity for the sake of the gospel
 - A. The goal comes first
 - B. Humility is a waste of time
 - C. The goal is the means
 - D. Get your eyes off your own feet and fix them on Christ (Matthew 14:29; Philippians 2:5-11)
