The Power in Rome

From the hoity-toity to the hoi polloi, the highfalutin to the homeboy, every soul is in desperate need of the Gospel. In ancient Rome there were highly educated and sophisticated people among both the Jews and the Gentiles and then there were the, well, maybe not so classy – shall we say, the original Barbarians, - and everyone in between. If you know your own heart and have been transformed by the power of Christ, you know that it is true – you are evidence and an illustration - the stronghold of your soul was demolished, and you have been taken captive by Christ through the power of the Gospel.
