God's Call For His People To Be A Treasured Possession Requires Testing To Prove Genuineness, (vs. 1 - 20)

God's Testing Disciplines His Children With Seasons Of Abundance To Teach Stewardship, (vs. 5 – 10)
We must trust that God is the One who will preserve to the end what He has promised, (vs. 7)

7.1) God's Purpose Is To Prosper His People

¹⁾ "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope. ²⁾ Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will hear you. ³⁾ You will seek me and find me, when you seek me with all your heart. I will be found by you, declares the LORD, ⁴⁾ and I will restore your fortunes and gather you from all the nations and all the places where I have driven you, declares the LORD, and I will bring you back to the place from which I sent you into exile." (Jeremiah 29:11–14, ESV)

7.2) God's Prosperity Is The Abundance Of His Nature

"for my people have committed two evils: they have forsaken me, the fountain of living waters, and hewed out cisterns for themselves, broken cisterns that can hold no water." (Jeremiah 2:13, ESV)

7.3) The Abundance Of God's Nature Is The Indwelling Spirit

¹⁾ "Jesus stood up and cried out, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. ²⁾ Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.' " ³⁾ Now this he said about the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were to receive, for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified." (John 7:37–39, ESV)

7.4) The Indwelling Spirit Is The Promise Of Inheritance

¹⁾ "In him we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will, so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of his glory. ²) In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of his glory." (Ephesians 1:11–14, ESV)

"Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water." 2) ... Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again.
