## **Ouestions to discuss:**

- Which of the reasons given for lack of prayer do you see best describes your current struggles in prayer?
- In your own words discuss and describe the link between reading/meditation of the Word and prayer.
- Which verses most compelled you to want to pray? Why?
- Do you have a set time that you pray daily? If not, why?
- How does planned prayer cultivate unceasing prayer?
- How does prayerlessness reveal ingratitude? Pride?

## Practical helps to cultivate prayer:

- Confess prayerlessness, unbelief and pride (Believing God in Christ has forgiven you & wants you to pray)
- Read and meditate on Scripture daily which will compel you to worship/pray.
- Write down promises from Scripture to "lay hold of God" in prayer (Gen 32)
- Use times through the day to pray (Shower, when exercising, driving, during lunch break)
- Have a prayer journal (Write down what you are praying for, and see God's answers)
- Pray through the church directory (specifically for people, ask them what you can pray for and follow up, so as to adjust your prayers). Then serve one another as needed, and fulfill one another's.
- Pray out loud to keep your mind from wondering or falling asleep.
- Choose one person (in the class) to meet with once a week for 30 minutes to pray (on the phone or in person). Commit to at least 4 weeks, and then choose someone else. Write out topics you will be praying for: each other (areas of sanctification), thanksgiving, church, missions, lost family, etc. Young people, you too!!

## V. Encouragement to Pray

- **Phil 1:19** for I know through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance
- Luke 18:1-8 And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart

- Luke 11:9-10 Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened.
- 1 Peter 5:7 Casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you
- James 4:2-3 You do not have, because you do not ask. 3 You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions.
- James 1:5 If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him
- 1 John 5:14-15 And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us. And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him.
