**begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father; by whom all things were made; who for us and for our salvation came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; He suffered and was buried; and the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father; and He shall come again, with glory, to judge both the living and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end.**

**And we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son; who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified; who spoke by the prophets; and we believe in one holy catholic<sup>2</sup> and apostolic church; we acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins; and we look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

## **Standing Orders**

**1. Press On!**

**2. Hold Tight!**

**3. Stand Firm!**

CONCLUSION: In reviewing this section of Philippians we can summarize it with three short commands: Press On! Hold Tight! and Stand Firm! We are to press on to take hold of Christ as He has taken hold of us. We are to hold tight to mature, biblical thinking and follow the model of godly living. We are to stand firm in our love relationship with Christ and with one another in His family. Let us delight in Jesus who has set His love upon us together.

## **Colossians 3:1-4**

If then *you have been raised with Christ*, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. <sup>2</sup> Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. <sup>3</sup> For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. <sup>4</sup> *When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.*

## **Ephesians 2:8-10**

“For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, *that we should walk in them.*”

## **First Peter 5:1-4**

So I exhort the elders among you, as a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, as well as a partaker in the glory that is going to be revealed: <sup>2</sup> shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain, but eagerly; <sup>3</sup> not domineering over those in your charge, but being examples to the flock. <sup>4</sup> And when the chief Shepherd appears, *you will receive the unfading crown of glory.*

## **Romans 6:1-4**

What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? <sup>2</sup> By no means! *How can we who died to sin still live in it?* <sup>3</sup> Do you not know that all of us who have been *baptized into Christ Jesus* were baptized into his death? <sup>4</sup> We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, *in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.*

## **John 11:25-27**

<sup>25</sup> Jesus said to her, “*I am the resurrection and the life.* Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, <sup>26</sup> and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?” <sup>27</sup> She said to him, “Yes, Lord; I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who is coming into the world.”

## **Second Corinthians 12:9-10**

<sup>9</sup> But he said to me, “My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.” Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, *so that the power of Christ may rest upon me.* <sup>10</sup> For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

# Taking Gathered Worship Home

The city of Philippi had a lot of retired Roman soldiers. This section focuses on action that is borne out of Christ's love for us together. This affection for the *bond of brothers* is to be the driving force in all that we do.

*Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.*

## Sunday Morning

**READ Philippians 3:10-4:1; Zephaniah 3:14-20; Colossians 3:1-4, Ephesians 2:8-10; First Peter 5:1-4; Romans 6:1-4; John 11:25-27; Second Corinthians 12:9-10.** DISCUSS What about Christ's love for us together enables us to pursue, hold, and stand? How can you rejoice today? What needs to change in your life as a result of this truth? MEDITATE on **Galatians 5:1.** PRAY "Jesus, enable us to rejoice in You together."

## Monday

**READ Philippians 3:10-4:1; Zephaniah 3:14-20; Colossians 3:1-4.** DISCUSS Whom does God sing over? Why? How does His rejoicing enable us to rejoice? What does it mean to seek things above? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own!* MEDITATE on **Galatians 5:1.** PRAY, "Lord, *make us know Your love* with certainty. Teach us to lean into Your rejoicing over us in Christ as we face difficulty, heartache, and uncertainty."

## Tuesday

**READ Philippians 3:10-4:1; Ephesians 2:8-10; First Peter 5:1-4.** DISCUSS What does it mean for us to walk in good works? How is God's loving preparation of these works for us to walk in a tender indication of His affection? What does awaiting the Chief Shepherd look like? What does it mean to follow one another's example in Christ? MEDITATE on **Galatians 5:1.** PRAY, "Jesus, we are fearful and unloving. But You have made us Your beloved. Enable us to stand."

### Wednesday

READ **Philippians 3:10-4:1; Romans 6:1-4; John 11:25-27**. DISCUSS How does Christ's resurrection encourage our walking in newness of life? What does it mean practically to believe that Jesus is the resurrection who has come into the world? MEDITATE on **Galatians 5:1**. PRAY, "Lord, forgive us for our cold hearts. We know *we are powerless to love You as we should*, but help us to make use of the tools You have given us to nurture the warmth You provide."

### Thursday

READ **Philippians 3:10-4:1; Second Corinthians 12:9-10; Zephaniah 3:14-20**. DISCUSS What does it mean for God to be strong in our weakness? How is this pictured in Zephaniah? Ask the Lord to meet you in your weakness. MEDITATE on **Galatians 5:1**. PRAY, "Lord, please be strong in our weakness. Embolden our feeble hearts, we beg You."

### Friday

READ **Philippians 3:10-4:1; Zephaniah 3:14-20; Colossians 3:1-4, Ephesians 2:8-10; First Peter 5:1-4; Romans 6:1-4; John 11:25-27; Second Corinthians 12:9-10**. DISCUSS, What have you been learning from these passages? How has God been convicting you from these passages this week? MEDITATE on **Galatians 5:1**. PRAY that we at FCCW would *honor Christ*.

### Saturday

PREPARE today for the service tomorrow which is *available both in-person and via live-stream*. READ **Philippians 4:1-23**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for *Sunday School at 9:00* and the *10:30 service*. Ask Jesus to gather us together joyfully to praise Him.
