Theme: Godliness is not a means to worldly wealth but of heavenly, eternal gain. It is the fruit of a life that is at peace with God, content with whatever our circumstances under his hand.

Background: "Teach and urge these things." A quick review:

Introduction: It took me a long time to realize I don't see what I don't see – either in the world or in my life! They are called "blind spots."

- I. "Godliness" Is the Goal
 - A. Godliness in the Pastoral Epistles a major theme in 1 Timothy
 - B. What is godliness?
 - 1. The reality of true godliness
 - a. It is not just "doing good things"
 - b. It is: a heart that is at peace and "right" with God actions spring from a heart that is captivated by God's goodness
 - 2. The appearance of godliness (2 Timothy 3:5)
 - a. Seeking God's acceptance through your behavior the expectation that "I will be rewarded for this"
 - b. Pursuing "godliness" for material (or spiritual) gain The issue Paul has in front of him/us.
 - True Godliness v.3 "teaching that accords with godliness"? A change of heart, not just actions
- II. Godliness for Material Gain
 - A. False teachers
 - 1. Different teaching??
 - a. Not the "sound words" of Lord Jesus ("Sound," because they are the Word of God)
 - b. Not the "teaching that accords with godliness"
 - 1) The gospel as declared by the Apostles "The one who hears you hears me" (Luke 10:16)
 - 2. Wandering from the truth (1:6; 6:10) They got lost listening to themselves
 - B. Serious consequences (4)
 - 1. Conceited and Ignorant (Puffed up)
 - 2. Divisive
 - a. Loving controversy and quarreling (arguing)
 - b. Not talking about Christ and His work
 - 3. Lovers of Money
 - a. They think godliness is a path to "gain"
 - b. Their real desire?? "...to be rich" (9)
 - C. Grave danger for teachers and hearers
 - 1. A temptation and trap devised by their own desires (James 1:14, 15)
 - 2. Ruin and destruction (9) "Plunged", drowning in, immersed in...
 - 3. Depraved and deprived
 - a. Depravity of life (life of dreadful sin)
 - b. Deprived (and depriving others) of the truth
 - c. For what??!!...
 - 4. A treacherous love
 - a. A love that is the root of all kinds of evils
 - 1) An almost endless list can be made
 - 2) Jesus warns, "Be on your guard" (Luke 12:15)

- b. A subtle deception Our materialistic age
- c. None of it goes with us! (7)
- III. Godliness, with Contentment, Is Gain?
 - A. Confirming the truth:
 - 1. Godliness is great gain with contentment! Not financial gain but spiritual life! (1 Timothy 4:8)
 - 2. What is contentment? It is rooted in peace with God (Philippians 4:11-13; 3:8-10)
 - B. The contrast
 - 1. Covetousness I want what I don't have
 - 2. Contentment
 - a. I don't need much! I already have everything in Christ Jesus my Lord!!
 - b. Doesn't depend on circumstances!
 - c. Opens our hearts to the needs of others
 - C. The challenge Checking for "blind spots"

Conclusion: Godliness is not a means to worldly wealth but of heavenly, eternal gain. It is the fruit of a life that is at peace with God, content with whatever our circumstances under his hand. We must pursue godliness, giving of our lives and possessions – which leads to lasting joy for you personally while opening the door for other's spiritual and physical life. The failure to do so may bring ruin and destruction.
