- Oswald J. Smith, "The light that shines the farthest will shine the brightest at home."

To Preach the Truth

- The spoken person-to-person proclamation of the Gospel is God's chosen method for His people to reconcile the world to Himself. Romans 10:13-15; 1 Cor. 1:20-25; Matthew 28:18-20.
- See also John 14:15, 15:16; Acts 9; Matthew 9:36; Hebrews 12:2; Isaiah 55:11.

- The desire of the proconsul was to, "hear the word of God." Acts 13:7.
- The object of the proconsul's astonishment was, "the teaching of the Lord." Acts 13:12.

To Face the Enemy

- See Acts 13:6-11, 16:16-24; Revelation 12:9; 1 John 5:19; Ephesians 2:1-3; 2 Corinthians 4:4; John 10:10, 12:31; Luke 4:1-13, 22:31; Matthew 4:1-11; Mark 9:40.
- There is no neutrality in the world. Mark 9:40 says, "40 For the one who is not against us is for us."
- Elymas (meaning a wise man) is called false prophet, magician, son of the devil, enemy of all righteousness, full of deceit and villiany, and Paul accuses him of "making crooked the straight paths of the Lord."

By the Power of the Holy Spirit

Israel, Acts 13:16-22

- Faithful Jews knew that Messiah (Christ, or the Anointed One) would come from the line of David and would rule over all nations from that throne. See 2 Samuel 7.
- Encouragement: Our faith comes from a historic context recorded in the Bible. It would be wise for us to know and understand these things so that we will not fail as the Jewish leadership in Jerusalem failed. Acts 13:27.

Jesus, Acts 13:23-37

• Paul emphasizes Jesus' fulfillment of several things. The ability to precisely predict far-future events and bring them to pass is a work of God. See Isaiah 41:26, 46:10.

- John the Baptist was the first prophet to speak since the prophet Malachi about 450 years prior. John was expected because prophecies in Malachi suggested a prophet would come before the Messiah. Luke 1:11-17; Isaiah 40:3; Malachi 3:1, 4:4-6.
- It was also well known that the Christ (Messiah) would be of the lineage of David. 2 Samuel 7; Isaiah 55:3; Psalm 2, 16, 110.
- Failure to understand Jesus' fulfillment of prophecies lies at the core of the failure of Israel's leadership in Jerusalem. Acts 13:27; Luke 19:44, 24:25-27, 24:44;
- Gospel essentials, Acts 13:28-31, 1 Corinthians 15:1-8:
 - o Crucifixion
 - o Burial
 - Resurrection
 - Appearances
 - Application You

You, Acts 13:38-52

- The temptation is to evaluate the Gospel while disconnected from it, but that is simply not possible, because it has relevance to each one of us.
- There was exactly one chosen nation, one king David, and one savior Jesus Christ. so there is just one way to be saved.

Encouragements

- Do not condemn the Lord Jesus with your unbelief. Acts 13:27.
- Move on to other opportunities if the Gospel is rejected. Acts 13:46.

The Religions of Men, Acts 14:8-23

Introduction

Lystra - southern Asia minor. Acts 14, 16:1-3; 2 Timothy 3:11. Note that Timothy is from Lystra. King Lycaon (See Acts 14:11) is mentioned in Metamorphoses by Ovid.

We Preach to Religious People

- Two myths to dispel:
 - Some people are not religious.
 - Unbelief equals ignorance
- See John 3:18; Mark 16:16; Romans 1:18ff.
- Today's primary religion: Humanism
 - o All meaning for life, all authority, all basis of morality and truth are found in human beings and human

- systems. All hope for the future is to be found in human progress.
- Scientism
- o Expressive Individualism

Most Will Reject Truth

- Even in the face of great signs.
- Even in the presence of perfect teaching.
- Because they love their religion and their sin.

But Some Will Believe

- Let God reveal himself to others.
 - o First in evangelism desire. Matthew 9:36.

No Small Dissension, Acts 15:1-21

Two Issues

- Is it necessary to keep all the law of Moses in order to be saved? (This time)
- Is it necessary to keep all the law of Moses in order to be faithful? (Next time)

The Judaizers

- Acts 15:1, "Unless you are circumcised according to the custom of Moses, you cannot be saved." See Genesis 17; Exodus 4:24-26, 12:48; Leviticus 12:3; Deuteronomy 10:16, 30:6; Joshua 5.
- The relevance of this passage: The modern-day equivalents, "You cannot be saved..."...unless you belong to this group...unless you do this ritual...unless you obey these rules."

Peter

- Peter gives a God-centered account of his experience, Acts 15:7-11: God chose...God bore witness...God made no distinction...[God] cleansed their hearts.
- Peter sums this up in a reversal of the normal order of things Jew first, then Gentile - by saying, "we will be saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus, just as they will." Acts 15:11.

Peter's conclusion: It is by grace that we are saved, apart from the works of the Law, because that is how it went down in Cornelius' house.

Barnabas and Paul

In Acts 15:12, Barnabas and Paul relate "signs and wonders" God did through them in their ministry to the Gentiles. This is an argument that their gospel message (salvation by grace through faith) is endorsed by God. See also Galatians 2:1-10.

James

- In Acts 15:13-21, James argues from scripture that the inclusion of the Gentiles was prophesied citing Amos 9:11-12. See also Genesis 12:3, 49:10, Deuteronomy 32:21; Psalm 2:8, 86:9; Isaiah 2:2-4, 9:2, 42:4, 49:6; Daniel 7:14; Haggai 2:7; Zechariah 2:11; Matthew 8:11.
- James concludes with a four-fold recommendation for Gentile behavior. Abstain from: Things polluted by idols; sexual immorality; what has been strangled;blood

Conclusions

- Salvation is "by grace through faith" plus nothing. This belief is called monergism. See Ephesians 2:1-10, 1:3-14; Matthew 19:26. Also see whitesrun.org/what-we-believe.
- Adding anything to the work of Christ to accomplish salvation is called synergism. Synergism is flatly refuted here in Acts 15 in in Galatians 1-6.

Objections

- So we can live how we want? See James 2:14-26; John 14:15, 21; Romans 6:1-14; 1 John 3:4, 8; Revelation 21:8.
- Don't some verses add something to faith for salvation? Acts 2:38, 3:19, 20:21, 26:20; Romans 10:9; Luke 12:8; Matthew 10:22, 24:13. Faith/belief is the common element. All additions are appropriate responses to the faith or "deeds in keeping with...repentance." See Hebrews 11 and Romans 5.

Encouragements

- Trust in Jesus Christ alone for salvation.
- Examine yourself for the fruits of this salvation.

See also Matt. 22:44; Mark 12:36; Luke 20:42, 43; Acts 2:34, 35; Ephesians 1:20, Colossians 3:1; Hebrews 1:13, 8:1, 10:12-13, 12:2,
- Answer Part 2: Daniel 7:13. Jesus takes it up a notch by referring to imagery found in Isaiah 7 that speaks of "one like a son of man" who is presented before God, conquers the nations, and enjoys and everlasting dominion. See Deuteronomy 33:26; Psalm 68:32-33; Psalm 104:1-4; Isaiah 19:1, and other references to clouds in connection with God's glory. The claim is truly blasphemy - unless it's true!
- Answer Part 3: Jesus implies that these events will be seen by his audience, "from now on you (plural) will see..." Matthew 26:64. See Acts 13:33 - Psalm 2:7; Romans 1:4; Ephesians 1:20-23.



Support

Paul was gathering financial support for the poor Christians in the Jerusalem area. The extra people with him were representatives of the churches that were sending support. See Acts 20:4, 24:17; Galatians 2:10; Romans 15:25-27; 1 Corinthians 16:1-9; 2 Corinthians 8-9.

Encouragement

In the Christian context: Our primary driver is faith - so it is safe to say that encouragement is the increasing of one's faith. How? By drawing focus to the person and work of Jesus Christ. We increase in our faith when the object of our faith is enlarged and brought into focus.

Applications



- Paul's companions in Acts 21:4, "through the Spirit" tell him not to go, and in Acts 21:11 warn of what will take place. Act 21:12 shows their determination to stop him.
- Is God divided? Is the Holy Spirit conflicted? Does God send mixed messages? Does God test His people?
- The greater questions: Why would God's people be tested? Why would God's people suffer at all?

- The Good News: Acts 21:19-20a "After greeting them, he related one by one the things that God had done among the Gentiles through his ministry. And when they heard it, they glorified God."
- They glorified God. See Acts 4:21, 11:18; 1 Corinthians 3:6-7; John 17:1-5, 17:22; Isaiah 43:7, 55:10-13.

The Bad News

- The elders received Paul, believed Paul, and have previously endorsed Paul. (Galatians 2:7-10) They did not believe the rumors. And they shouldn't. For due process, see Dt. 19:15; Matthew 18:15-20; 1 Timothy 5:19. For gossip, see Leviticus 19:6; Proverbs 16:28, 17:9, 20:19; Romans 1:29; 1 Timothy 5:13.
- The Bad News: Acts 21:21 "They have been told about you that you teach all the Jews who are among the Gentiles to

- forsake Moses, telling them not to circumcise their children or walk according to our customs." See Acts 6:11-13.
- In summary, what Paul really taught on the issue: As a Gentile convert, you were not under obligation to participate in the customs of Judaism. As a Jew, you were not under obligation to stop participating in the customs of Judaism. Acts 15; Galatians 4:1-11; Romans 14:1-15:7.

The Outreach

 Practicing what he preached: Paul taught that secondary issues involving the practice of our faith should not cause division among us, Romans 14:1-15:7; Numbers 6; Ephesians 4:1-3; 1 Corinthians 9:19-23; Romans 12:18.

Cleverness and Care; Acts 22:30-23:35

The Roman Authorities

- Notice that Roman authorities have not persecuted Christians to this point, but have sought only to keep the peace.
- It was illegal for an uncondemned Roman Citizen to be bound, Acts 21:33, 22:29, or to be flogged, Acts 22:25-26. But this treatment was fine for non-citizens.
- Paul's interaction: He claimed his rights, and used the legal protections of the governing authority.

The Jewish Council

• Paul's interaction: He tried to make a defense. He held them accountable to their own laws. He shut down the proceedings when he saw that they were getting nowhere. See Acts 22:30-23:10; Deuteronomy 25:1-2; Exodus 22:28.

The Lord Jesus

- Paul's interaction: Paul received encouragement from the Lord. See Acts 23:11, 19:21, 22:15, 9:15.
- This fits a pattern of the Lord with Paul: Acts 22:17-21, 18:9-10, 27:22-25, 2 Timothy 4:16-17.
- But this is the way of the Lord Jesus with all of His people: Matthew 9:2, 9:22, 14:27; John 16:33.

The Conspiracy

- Paul's record of danger: Acts 9:22-25, 9:29, 13:50-51, 14:5, 14:19-20, 18:12-17, 20:19, 20:3; 1 Thessalonians 2:14-16.
- Paul's Interaction: He makes the danger known to the authorities in order to avoid the violent plot. Acts 23:12-35.

- The Lord's Supper is one of two ordinances of the church commanded by Jesus to be observed by His Church. It is the taking of bread and wine (or grape juice) to signify respectively the body and blood of Jesus Christ that was given for us.
- From the Baptist Faith and Message: "The Lord's Supper is a symbolic act of obedience whereby members of the church, through partaking of the bread and the fruit of the vine, memorialize the death of the Redeemer and anticipate His second coming." http://www.whitesrun.org/what-webelieve/

What does the Lord's Supper signify?

• It is a celebration of what Jesus Christ has done for us in giving his body and his blood for the payment of our sin debt.

- "Eucharist" means thanksgiving. It is a memorial. 1 Corinthians 11:24-25; Luke 22:20; Hebrews 9:15-24; Genesis 3.
- It is also a look forward to the hope of his return. 1 Corinthians 11:26; Matthew 26:29; Mark 14:25; Luke 22:18.

The Creative Solution, Acts 24:27-25:12

Introduction

- Paul's destiny in Rome: Acts 9:15, 19:21, 23:11, 25:11-12.
- Believers should pursue the path laid out for them by God, no matter how unusual it may appear.

The New Guy

• Porcius Festus - Roman Procurator of Judea for a short period of time beginning around AD 60. He had a reputation for being more wise and just than Felix. Acts 25:27-26:32.

Paul's Dilemma

- Going to Jerusalem was not an option. Acts 25:3, 23:16-22, 21:13.
- Having a trial and potentially being released from Caesarea was not an option. Acts 25:3.
- Having a trial and being found guilty was not an option. Acts 19:21, 23:11.

Paul's Creative Solution

- It's unlikely that the Jews would make the trip to Rome for the trial, and even more unlikely they would be able to find and bring witnesses.
- It would also be very unlikely that the Jews would find "favors" in Rome as they had with Felix and Festus locally.

Encouragements

- We must make every effort to finish the course. While Paul was willing to die, Acts 21:13, he made every effort to continue on to finish the course. Acts 20:24, 2 Timothy 4:7.
- We must take courage in the fact that God is continually at work for the benefit of his people. Romans 8:28; Ezra 8:22; Ecclesiastes 8:12.
 - o Romans 8:28, "And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose."
 - o However, if we are not abiding in Christ, we lose our confidence. This verse does not absolve us of responsibility for our actions or excuse our foolishness. It promises no protection from the consequences of our actions. Indeed, as the faithful of Christ, we should be working to better our situation, stay blameless, and further the gospel.
