The Vanity of Scholarship

Ecclesiastes 1:12-18; Jer 9:23-24; 1 Cor 1:24, 27-31

- I. THE QUALITY OF THE SCHOLAR (12-14, 16)—seeks truth/meaning
 - **A.** <u>Credentialed</u>—knowledge, experience, position of respect and resources
 - 1. Position—king over Israel in Jerusalem
 - 2. Opportunity—access to world's most educated, best informed
 - 3. Time—hours in the day, a lifetime of observation and experience
 - a. He has time to study
 - b. He has a lifetime of experience.
 - B. <u>Sincere</u>—wants to **find** the **truth**, not playing intellectual games
 - C. <u>Thorough</u>—careful, diligent, conscientious
 - 1. What he has objectively observed
 - 2. What he has personally experienced
 - **D.** <u>Honest</u>—doesn't sugar-coat anything, honest about his findings; not what he expected.
 - 1. About himself—his limits as a mortal man
 - **2. About the world**—The more he sees, the more he weeps.

II. THE FRUSTRATIONS OF THE SCHOLAR (13b, 18)

- A. Striving After Wind (14)—futile, chasing or trying to shepherd wind
- B. Bent Out of Shape (15a)—the dysfunction we can see but not fix
- C. <u>Deficit in Accounting</u> (15b)—something missing we can't explain
- **D.** <u>Applying Traditional Morality</u> (17)—Traditional morality does not satisfy; neither do absurdity or the practice of immorality.

III. THE WITNESS OF THE SCHOLAR (13b, 18)—

A. Scholarship can't provide the meaning of life.

We can't help asking the ultimate questions but we can't ultimately find the answers apart from God.

B. The world is broken and we can't fix it.

The closer we look, the more problems we see.

The deeper we look, the more dysfunction we discover.

The more we study, the more complicated everything becomes.

C. We need more than a Teacher; we need a Savior. (Jn 14:6; 1 Cor 1:24; Rev 5)
