**Leviticus 13:45-46** <sup>45</sup> "Now the leper on whom the sore *is*, his clothes shall be torn and his head bare; and he shall cover his mustache, and cry, 'Unclean! Unclean!' <sup>46</sup> "He shall be unclean. All the days he has the sore he shall be unclean. He *is* unclean, and he shall dwell alone; his dwelling *shall be* outside the camp. (NKJV)

**Revelation 21:27** <sup>27</sup> But there shall by no means enter it anything that defiles [unclean], or causes an abomination or a lie, but only those who are written in the Lamb's Book of Life. (NKJV)

**Romans 10:13** <sup>13</sup> For "whoever calls on the name of the LORD shall be saved." (NKJV)

**Leviticus 14:1-7, 12-14, 19-20** <sup>1</sup> Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>2</sup> "This shall be the law of the leper for the day of his cleansing: He shall be brought to the priest. <sup>3</sup> "And the priest shall go out of the camp, and the priest shall examine *him*; and indeed, *if* the leprosy is healed in the leper, <sup>4</sup> "then the priest shall command to take for him who is to be cleansed two living *and* clean birds, cedar wood, scarlet, and hyssop. <sup>5</sup> "And the priest shall command that one of the birds be killed in an earthen vessel over running water. <sup>6</sup> "As for the living bird, he shall take it, the cedar wood and the scarlet and the hyssop, and dip them and the living bird in the blood of the bird *that was* killed over the running water. <sup>7</sup> "And he shall sprinkle it seven times on him who is to be cleansed from the leprosy, and shall pronounce him clean, and shall let the living bird loose in the open field ... <sup>12</sup> "And the priest shall take one male lamb and offer it as a trespass offering, and the log of oil, and wave them *as* a wave offering before the LORD. <sup>13</sup> "Then he shall kill the lamb in the place where he kills the sin offering and the burnt offering, in a holy place; for as the sin offering *is* the priest's, so *is* the trespass offering. It *is* most holy. <sup>14</sup> "The priest shall take *some* of the blood of the trespass offering, and the priest shall put *it* on the tip of the right ear of him who is to be cleansed, on the thumb of his right hand, and on the big toe of his right foot ... <sup>19</sup> "Then the priest shall offer the sin offering, and make atonement for him who is to be cleansed from his uncleanness. Afterward he shall kill the burnt offering. <sup>20</sup> "And the priest shall offer the burnt offering and the grain offering on the altar. So the priest shall make atonement for him, and he shall be clean. (NKJV)

**Isaiah 53:5** <sup>5</sup> ... He *was* wounded for our transgressions, *He was* bruised for our iniquities; The chastisement for our peace *was* upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed. (NKJV)
