What gives your life meaning?

- Recognize that God is in control, and you can't manipulate the future.
- Recognize that the world is broken, and you can't fix it—only God can.
- Recognize that you are going to die and stand before God.
- So live for God and receive his gifts with thankful joy.

The Main Point of Ecclesiastes 11:7–12:7

Young people, receive daily joys from the hand of God (11:7–10), fully recognizing that one day you will die and stand before your Creator to be judged for how you lived (12:1–7).

How do I live wisely before God, especially when I'm young?

1. Continually rejoice in God's gifts to you (11:7–10).

How? Cultivate a strong habit of prayer. As Calvin taught, prayer keeps your heart:

- focused on God as your kind provider,
- pure before God through confession, more delighted and joyful in God, & expectant of God's help.

7	"the almond tree blossoms"	White hair
8	"the grasshopper drags itself along"	Awkward movement
9	"and desire fails"	Sexual impotence

Conclusion: Old age isn't all bad.

- Abraham died in "good old age" (Genesis 15:15).
- Old age is a time to tell the next generation of God's goodness (Psalm 71).
- Gray hair is generally honorable and beautiful (Proverbs 16:31; 20:29).
- Long life should be valued but not idolized (Proverbs 3:16; 1 Kings 3:11).
- Aging is often a tool that God uses to make us wise (Ecclesiastes 12).
