Jesus. All our sins and griefs to bear. And what a privilege it is to

carry everything to God in prayer. He says, oh what needless pain,

oh what needless sorrow we bear. All because we don't take what?

Everything to God in prayer. Alright, well we're going to

be back in John chapter 14 again this morning. And I don't know

how far we've got. We've got about six more verses

left. But I don't know if we'll get through them today, tell

you the truth or not. Because there's just so much

here in this 14th chapter. When Jesus gets to chapter 14,

remember he starts speaking to his disciples. And He's speaking

to us, right? And He's telling us that we,

as He said a little while earlier, He says that we should pray,

what? If we ask anything in His name,

right? And what does that mean? That

the Spirit is coming in accordance with everything that Jesus is.

and everything that Jesus does. And this is where we kind of

get, some people, some groups get a little carried away with

the Holy Spirit. Remember our focus should always

be Jesus Christ. If our focus is anything beyond

Jesus Christ, we're in the wrong spot, no matter what it is. Whether

it's serving or this or that, Jesus is always central to everything

we do. And so he says, the Father will

send the Holy Spirit in His name. He's sending Him because of who

Jesus is, what Jesus is going to do. And then he says, He will teach you all things. Now, all things are not everything that we could ever know. We'll learn all that one day when we get to heaven. But the things that he's talking about is all the things that he said to them because he kind of clarifies it. He says, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all things that I have said to you. What's going on here? He says, He will bring to remembrance all things I said to you. I'll read a couple of verses here in Luke chapter 24. It says, talking about they went to the grave and they looked for the body and the angels were there. And there were two men stood by in shiny garments. Then as they were afraid, verse 5, they bowed their faces to the earth. And they said to them, why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but is risen. Remember how he spoke to you when he was still in Galilee, saying the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and the third day rise again. And they remembered his words. And in John 12, remember when Jesus rode down the streets of Jerusalem on the donkey and they were crying out, Hosanna, Hosanna, blessed comes the King, blessed he who comes in the name of the Lord, the King of Israel. And it says, and Jesus, when he found a young donkey, verse 14, sat on it as is written, fear not, daughter of Zion, behold, your King is coming, sitting on a donkey's coal. His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified Then they remembered that these things were written about him and they had done these things to him So that was in John chapter 12, so and there's many other examples You know, that's how we got this New Testament right on these words rest the credibility and

ultimate divine authority of our Gospels Because you know

what? How do you think these guys wrote

the New Testament? They wrote the New Testament

based on what God spoke to them, right? The book of John about

60 years after it occurred. Did you know that? He wrote the

book of John about 60 years after it occurred. Now how does he

remember all these events? Because God gave him all the

information. He remembers it because God did

it, right? Think about it. Probably nobody

could tell me what I preached on last week, but you know what?

Or we might not remember what we did ten minutes ago or yesterday. But these guys wrote down what

they did 60 years ago, what God told them to write down. They

wrote it down. The Bible tells us that God inspired

it. He says He will teach you all

things. In other words, He will explain

the words to them. And He will bring to your remembrance

all things I said to you. And then Jesus goes on in verse

27 and says, Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you,

not as the world gives do I give you. Let not your heart be troubled,

neither let it be afraid. So Jesus says, Peace I leave

you, my peace I give you, not as the world gives you. And so

what does he say here? Notice what he says, peace I

leave with you. Then he says what? My peace I

give to you. It's not just anybody's peace,

but it's his peace. It's that peace that passes all

understanding. We've talked about that, right?

In Philippians chapter 4, verse 6 through 9, and he says that

don't be anxious for anything, but by prayer and supplication,

with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. And the

peace that passes all understanding will do what? Guard your hearts and minds. We're just saying, you know,

what a privilege to take everything to Jesus. Oh, what peace we offer

and forfeit. Oh, what needless pain we bear.

Why? We don't take everything to God in prayer. What are we

saying a little bit before that? Trust and obey. We've got to

trust. And that's what Jesus is saying

right here. Trust me because who can we trust

in this old world? I mean, sometimes I can't even

trust myself, you know, to do what I'm supposed to do or need

to do or want to do. And I know you the same way. But in this world of no peace,

especially today, it seems like it gets harder and harder and

harder to find peace and all the stress and all the strain

and all the everything that goes on in life sometimes. It just

gets harder and harder and harder. We look at the TV and we listen

to the news and we hear all the things that's going on and we

go, oh my goodness, what are we going to do? What's going

to happen? How am I going to live? How am I going to do this? How

am I going to do that? We just don't know. But Jesus says, peace

I leave with you. That's that word, Shalom, and

it became a New Testament greeting. And everywhere in the Bible,

Paul always started all his books of the Bible out. He says, Grace

and peace from the Lord Jesus Christ. And every time he starts

a book, I mean, number 626, I won't read all of these. I have got

about 10 or 15 of them. He says, number 626, the Lord

lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace. Psalm

2911, the Lord will give strength to his people. The Lord will

bless his people with peace. Isaiah 9, 6, and 7, for unto

us a child is born, unto us a son is given, and the government

will be upon his shoulder, and his name will be called Wonderful

Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the

increase of his government and peace, there will be no end. over and over and over again.

It says Isaiah 54 verse 13, all your children shall be taught

by the Lord and great shall be the peace of your children. and

the one we taught back in a couple of months ago. Romans chapter

5 verse 1 he says, Therefore, having been justified by God,

we have peace with God, right? And he says in Romans 14, 17,

that the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness

and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit. So God wants us to understand

that we can have peace. He gives us peace not as the

world gives peace. How does the world give peace?

We think we can or we try to overcome or we do some kind of

something. It comes in a bottle, it comes

in a container, a pill bottle, it comes in a liquor bottle that

comes in all kinds of other directions. I was reading a book a couple

of days ago, and the man said that he was talking to this drug

rep, and she said that two-thirds of all the women were on antidepressants. And I understand some people

need to be on those things. But the bottom line is, is if

we've got a Savior who we trust, We don't need all the things

that the world provides. Because we've got somebody we

can trust and we don't need to be depressed and worried about

everything. And Jesus says, look, if you

trust in me, if you believe in me, let not your heart be troubled. Neither let it be afraid. Don't

be afraid. Don't be worried. Who can you

count on? You can always count on Jesus,

can't you? Does Jesus ever let you down? He never does, does

He? And if you can trust on Jesus

anytime, anywhere, call on Him anytime, anywhere, never get a busy signal, then guess what? You don't have to worry. Because the worst thing that can happen to us is we can pass out of this world and go to heaven a little earlier if we know Jesus. And so Jesus says, my peace I give you, my peace I leave with you. He says, look, don't worry, don't be afraid. The world says that When you have peace in the world, what do they say? Everything's going right. That's when the world has peace, right? They call it being happy or lucky. If everything's going my way, I'm okay. But when things go bad, what happens? People fall apart. But as Christians, we don't have to fall apart. Jesus said, in this world, you're going to have tribulation, but be of good cheer. I have overcome the world. That's what he tells them. He tells us that same thing. He says, don't be worried. Don't be afraid. Then he says in verse 28, you have heard me say to you, I am going away and coming back to you. if you love me you would rejoice because I said I'm going to the father for my father is greater than I. And so Jesus says hearing this verse that he says, you have heard me say to you, I'm going away. And then I'm coming back, right? So he says, if you had loved me, you would rejoice. Why? You know, they're more worried about themselves. See, they're afraid. They're worried. Why? Because Jesus has said he's going away. He's leaving. He says, where I'm going, you

can't come. And so they're like, well, what

are we going to do now? Here's the guy that we've been

depending on, encouraging us, walking with us, and helping

us, and being with us all these years. If Jesus is going to die, Peter's going to defect. Remember, he said that Peter's going to deny him three times. He says, what am I going to do? What are we going to do if all these things are happening? Our whole world is falling apart. And Jesus says, let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid. Don't worry. And then he says, look, if you had loved me, you would rejoice because I'm leaving. Why would they rejoice? Because see, Jesus has been in this human body for 33 years. The God that created everything, people, He's been on earth for 33 years and he's ready to go back to heaven and get the glory which he had before the foundation of the earth. Because see, Jesus, when he came to earth, what did he do? He became a man. He became a little baby. And he had to have his diaper changed. He had to grow up. He had to learn. He had to do all these things so that He could be tempted as we are. He could suffer all the things that we do. So that when He died on the cross, He could die in our place. Because only a not guilty person who is of the same kind can die in the place of somebody who is guilty. And so He had to do all that for us. And so basically what He says is, if you love me and you rejoice, because I said I'm going back to my Father. Because see, Jesus tells them in John 17 verse 5, He says, Glorify me now with the glory which I have before the foundation of the earth. Over and over and over again, John has told us that Jesus is God. That's the whole point of this book, is that we would believe that Jesus is the Christ and believe and we might have life in His name.

that He is God in a human body. And so He says, I'm going to

my Father, for my Father is greater than I. And you know, the cults

have had a field day with this verse here. They said, see, Jesus

is less than the Father. He's not God. He's just a created

being. He's not as great as God the

Father. And they will come to your door

and they will knock on your door. I guess they can't come over

here and knock on your door. But they knock on your doors

in your neighborhoods and they tell you, I believe in Jesus. And then you say, yeah, you do.

And you say, well, do you worship Jesus? Ask them, do they worship

Jesus? And they'll say no, because he's

not God. Because, see, they believe that Jesus is just a created

being. He was just a man. He was a prophet,

or He's a good man. Or He was a God, but He's not

the God. And so they don't believe what

we believe. And they'll use this verse on

you in a heartbeat. But see, why in the world would

John, who wrote this whole book and said that he wrote it, many

other signs Jesus did, He says, but these have been written that

you might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God,

and believe and you might have life in His name. And the whole

purpose of this book is to show us that Jesus is God. I mean,

who else but God can raise people from the dead? Who else but God

can still a storm, walk on the water, take two loaves and two

fish and five loaves and feed 15 or 20,000 people, can make

a man brand new eyes, take a man who's been laying by a pool 38

years and make him rise up and walk, heal withered hands, turn

water into wine. Who can do that? Only God. Why in the world now would he

say Jesus is less than God? He's not. Jesus is just saying,

when I get back to heaven, I'm going to be what I used to be. Because remember what we talked

about over Christmas? In Ephesians chapter 2, not Ephesians,

Philippians chapter 2 verse 8, And it says, and being found

in the appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient

to the point of death, even the death of the cross. Therefore,

God has also highly exalted him in giving the name which is above

every name, that at the name of Jesus, every knee should bow,

those in heaven and those on earth and those under the earth,

and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is

Lord. That is the name for God, to the glory of God the Father.

He is God. He is Lord. That is the word

used in the Old Testament for Lord. He is Yahweh. He is the great I Am. Jesus said

in John 8, before Abraham was, I Am. Why now would John say

that Jesus is not God after he's been saying for 14 chapters,

He is God? Because He is God. Not trying

to prove, but proving He is. He says, you would rejoice because

I'm going back to the Father and I'll have all my glory again. In verse 29 he says, and now

I've told you before it comes so that when it does come to

pass you may believe. See, you know one thing that's

great about this Bible is we can look in here and we can see

all the prophecies that have been fulfilled. Remember I told

you back in chapter 12, it was 183,000 and so many days until

Messiah was cut off. And exactly that day was the

day that Jesus came into Jerusalem, just as it was said. All these

things have been fulfilled. Jesus was born where he was supposed

to be born. He lived just as he was supposed

to live. Jesus fulfilled over 300 prophecies when he came.

He'll fulfill over 300 when He comes back again. And there's

been many, many more in here. I mean, even Alexander the Great

was foretold in here. How he'd conquer the whole world. And many other things were foretold. That Jesus would be born of a virgin. Over and over and over again, the Bible has been proved to be true. Jesus says now I've told you when it comes to pass that you may believe in other words your faith is going to be stronger, right? You can have greater faith greater strong faith because look I've told you something's going to happen and when it happens, you'll know that I was speaking the truth This is a work. This is a book we can trust in folks and I've never found anything that's not true and all the people who've tried to prove it not true, you know what they've done? They've gotten saved and trusted in the Lord Jesus Christ because they found out they couldn't disprove it. He says here, verse 30, I will no longer talk much with you for the ruler of this world is coming and he has nothing in me. That's kind of a Hebrew idiom that says that Satan had nothing on Jesus. In other words, Jesus had never done anything wrong. He had never sinned. He had never done anything wrong. So Satan could make no claim on Him. Could not charge Him with any sin. Therefore, Satan could not hold Him in death. And Christ, when He died on the cross, would triumph and destroy Satan. You know, the Bible tells us that the devil, Satan, is the ruler of this world. He's the prince of the power of the air. And he is the one who puts us in fear because of death. Hebrews 2.14 talks about the fact Verse 31, he says, but that the world may know that I love the Father, and as the Father gave me commandment, so I do. Arise, let us go from here. In other words, Jesus says, I want to let the world know that I love my Father. How do you

show love? By obeying somebody. By pleasing

somebody, right? And he says, I want to let the

world know that I love my Father, and as the Father gave commandment,

I'm going to do it. And he says, arise, let us go

from here. I don't know whether they went

and walked to the garden. The next scene kind of shows

them in the garden, but we won't get to that yet because he's

going to continue talking about the things they need to learn.

So we don't know if he was telling these things in the next couple

of chapters on the way to the garden or if they stayed there

or what. But maybe they just arose from

the table. But you know what? Jesus knew

that Judas and all the people were coming to get Him. But you

know what? Jesus is still in control. He's

telling these men what they need to hear. He's telling us what

we need to hear to live this life. Remember people, this Bible

is not just dribble. When we teach and when we hear

the Word of God, we're hearing the very words of God written

down for us. Folks, this is a love letter.

Do you know that? That's a love letter from God

to you and to me. He says, I love you, Marty. I

love you. I love you. And I love you. And

I love you. And I love all of y'all. And that's why I wrote

this Bible and I sent my son and I did all the things I did

because I want you to know that you can trust in everything I

say and do. And you can believe in me and

trust in me. You don't have to be afraid. You don't have to

be worried. But you can live your life trusting and obeying. Because there's no other way

to be, like I said, I'd like to change that word from happy

because happy means lucky. But to trust and obey for there's no other way to be joyful in Jesus. Because see, joy is based on knowing that no matter how bad things get, God's still on the throne and it's okay. Because the worst that can be thrown at us in this world is, you know, the worst thing that can ever happen to you in this world, that's as bad as it will ever get. The Bible says in Romans 8.18 that the sufferings of this world will not be worthy to be compared with the glory which we'll have in heaven. You got that? The sufferings of this world will not even be nothing compared to the glory which we'll have in heaven. Paul said this momentary light affliction which works a far more exceeding glory. He said this momentary light affliction and we all know what Paul went through. Paul went through way more than probably we've ever thought of going through. He was beaten, shipwrecked, stoned, and all kinds of stuff, left for dead. He was in peril of robbers and all kinds of stuff. So folks, just remember, let not your heart be troubled. Neither let it be afraid. Because you can trust in Him, right? Let's pray and we'll close. Father, we love You. We thank You. And we ask today that you would help each and every one of us. Lord, I know we're human beings. We're sinful creatures. And at times we fail to trust you. We get stressed. We get worried. But Lord, help us to remember that there's nothing that happens in this old world that you don't know about. Nothing's caught you off guard. As one man says, has it ever occurred to you that nothing ever occurs to God? That He knows everything before it ever happens. He knows our thoughts before

we think them. He knows that we're but dust

and yet He loves us anyway. So Father, help us to trust in You, to trust and obey, knowing that there is no other way to be joyful in Jesus, but to trust and obey. Father, give us strength and help to be the people we need to be. Because you are such a good God, a holy God, a wonderful God. If we would remember how wonderful and everything that you are, Lord, that we wouldn't be afraid, we wouldn't be anxious, but we would continue to trust in you. So Father, help us to do that. In Jesus' name, Amen. Try to think of a good one to sing after that one. How about number 43? I just turned straight to it, Love Lifted Me. Let's do number 43, Love Lifted Me.
