angels ♪ Yeah. Amen. What a friend we have in

Jesus. All of our griefs and sins to

bear. What a privilege we have to take

everything to God in prayer because He says, Oh what needless sorrow,

oh what needless pain we bear, all because we don't take everything

to God in prayer. We're going to be back in John

chapter 13 this morning, verse 12. Last week, remember we talked

about how they went to the Last Supper and they were all sitting

around probably a U-shaped table and everybody's feet would have

been in everybody's face. And all the disciples were fussing

and fighting over who was the greatest. And Jesus, I guess

after they had already started the supper, and He realizes nobody's

going to get up and wash anybody's feet. And so he gets up, he grabs

the wash basin, and he girds himself about with the towel,

and then he begins to wash everybody's feet, including Judas's, right? John chapter 13, verse 12. So, what happens is, he begins

to wash their feet, and as he's washing their feet, he gets to

old Peter. Peter says, Lord, no, not mine,

or you, mine, is really what the grief says. You, my feet? Uh-uh. No way, Lord. And Jesus looks at him and says,

look, if I don't bathe, if I don't wash your feet, you can't have

anything to do with me. In other words, we talked about

the fact that he says that some of y'all are clean, but not all

are clean. He said some have been bathed.

And when he says bathed, he was saying that they have been forgiven of their sins. They have been cleansed by the washing of the water of the word. That's what Titus chapter 3 verse 5 says. In Ephesians 5 25, Ephesians

5 says. In Ephesians 5 25, Ephesians 1 13 says that you've been, when you heard the word, the gospel of your truth, You believed it, you trusted it, and then you were sealed by the Holy Spirit of promise that you're forgiven at that moment. And at that moment, God washes all your sins away. He cleanses you. Baptism is just an outward symbol of an inward happening. You know, Jesus said that you do this In remembrance of me, when you take the Lord's Supper, he says, when you trust in me, you get baptized so that others know that there's been a change. You're not who you used to be. So that's what Jesus was saying, that not all were clean, and he was talking about Judas. Judas was right there with all these people, these disciples, for three and a half years and he never believed. You know, some people sit in church all their life and they never really truly trust Jesus Christ. Some of them don't ever really hear the truth because they don't go to churches that really teach that Jesus is the only way. that nothing else gets you there, that you can't work your way in, you can't be baptized in, communion doesn't do it. None of these things get you into heaven. Jesus says that if you believe, you trust in what He did on that cross and that alone, that's what gets you to heaven. You believe that He is who He said He is, and He did what He said He did. He would die for

our sins, die in our place. He took our health, He took our

cross, and when we trusted that, that alone, then we're saved. Because the Bible says in Ephesians again, you're saved by grace. That's giving us what we don't deserve. Through faith, it is the gift of God. Not a worse, lest anyone should boast. If we could do something to get into heaven, we'd all be up there saying, look what I did, look what I did. But see, it's all about Jesus getting the glory, about Him getting the glory. And so He says, not all of you are clean, but we talked about that washing the feet had to do with daily walking through the world, getting your feet dirty, getting smeared and just as you walk through the world you get dirty by seeing and hearing and all these things. And daily you have to go back to God for confession of sin. First John 1.9. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to keep on cleansing us from all unrighteousness. So when Jesus died, when He died on the cross, He said it's finished. It was a past action with a continuing result. In other words, what he did started in the past and it forgives all our sins when we trust him. But not only that, it continues to forgive every single sin that we have ever done, ever will do, because we're never going to be perfect until we get to heaven. Jesus knew that, God knew that, and Jesus is God, and so he realizes to have fellowship with each other, to have fellowship with God, we have to keep our accounts clean, right? Because what happens? If I get mad with somebody and I don't apologize, or they get mad with me and they don't apologize, then what happens? Our fellowship is broken, right? That's what Jesus is saying. Peter, you can't have any part with me. You can't have fellowship with me. You're still my son. You still

belong to me. But unless you daily ask for forgiveness, then you don't have that fellowship. You don't have that daily walk. Just like we were talking about, oh what needless pain we bear, what peace we often forfeit. All these things, we take them to God in prayer and ask Him to forgive us. And wash us and bathe us, wash our feet off, and then we can have fellowship again. When we get to verse 12 today, I just kind of wanted to go back over that because I know that that's kind of tricky for some people. And when we get to verse 12 today, he says, So when he had washed their feet, taken his garments, and sat down again, he said to them, do you know what I have done to you? You call me teacher and Lord, and you say, well, for so I am. If I then, your Lord and teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example that you should do as I have done unto you. Most assuredly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master. Nor is he who is sent greater than he who sent him. If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them." Let's stop right there and we'll see how far we get. Alright, so what happens? Jesus washes their feet. He says, and when he got through washing their feet, he takes his garments, he sat down again, and he looks at them and he says, Do you know what I have done to you? And he says, look, you call me teacher and Lord. In other words, you respect me as a teacher. You call me Lord. You say that I'm God from heaven. And if I'm God from heaven, and I'm your teacher, and you respect me, and you fear me and reverence me because I am God, he says, And you say, well, because so I am. He says, I am these things. He

says, if I then, and then he repeats it again, your Lord and teacher. have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. In other words, look, if I, the God of everything, that created everything, that made everything, the teacher, all these things, have done this for you, what ought you to do? Can you imagine having God washing your feet? That's what happens. I mean, God does wash us every day, but not quite, you know, like He does, like He did physically right there. But, you know, He's standing there washing Peter's feet. And, you know, that's a humbling experience. Now, you know, this is not the place where Jesus is saying, We're instituting foot washing as another ordinance. Jesus said there was two things to do until he came back. We're to baptize people and we're also to do the Lord's Supper. Those are the two things we do to remember what he's done for us and to show others who we are. Now he said, do you know what I have done to you? And then he says, you ought to wash one another's feet. He says, listen to what he says in verse 15. For I have given you an example that you should do as I have done unto you. And then he says here, go on. Most assuredly I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master, nor is he who is sent greater than he who sent him. If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them. So let me get to the point of this. What happens here? Jesus washes their feet. Jesus says, do you know what I've done? He says, if I'm the Lord and I'm the King of the universe and everything else, then what art you today? In other words, what he's saying is, I have served you. Isn't that what Jesus said? He said, Mark 10.45, I did not

come to be served, but to serve and to give my life as a ransom for many. See, He came to serve us, right? I mean, we talked about that in Philippians 2.5-11, how He was humble and He was obedient even to the point of death that He became a servant. He was serving us when He died on the cross. He was serving God when He died on the cross. Ultimately, He was serving Himself,

God, the Father, but He was serving us also because when He died,

He died for us, right? He died to satisfy God's wrath,

but He died so that we might go to heaven. Jesus says that

you should do as I have done to you. And one man said it like

this, it says, like ass. not do what I've done, but like

us. You know, it's sort of like,

what does the word like mean? Similar, right? Have you ever

what does the word like mean? Similar, right? Have you ever seen the pictures of Jesus being baptized and you see the dove coming down? Well, you know what the Bible says? It says that the Holy Spirit

came down like a dove. It didn't say a dove came down.

It said like a dove. He was gentle and he just kind of floated down and he was gentle and peaceful and he just came down. It doesn't mean that it was a

dove. But we always see pictures of doves, right? Well, guess what? They've done the same thing here.

Well, we're going to wash feet now because Jesus did it. Well, yeah, there's nothing wrong with washing people's feet, but if you ever go to a foot washing service, probably everybody's done washed their feet, scrubbed them some clean, they don't need to be washed. But I guess the object is, you know, you're showing humility, you're showing service. And what Jesus is saying is, look, in the same manner, do whatever it takes to serve other

people. Whatever it takes. You know, and it's tough to serve people, isn't it? Because some of us are pretty ornery. I know I am sometimes, you know. And he said, in Matthew 25, he says, talks about that. He says, if you've given a cup of cold water in my name, you visited those who are sick and those who are in prison, guess what? If you've done it unto the least of these, you've done it unto me. So when we serve others, guess who we're ultimately serving? Jesus. Isn't that what Jesus was doing when He died on the cross? Yes, He was serving us in a way because He died in our place and He died for our sins, but ultimately He was serving God. He was serving the fact that God's justice had to be satisfied. And every time we serve each other, every time we love each other, every time we do something for one another, Jesus said, I'm trying to remember the chapter, but he says, they will know you by your love one for another, right? And how do you love people? You love them by doing for them, regardless of whether they deserve it or not. You know, all the time we hear people say, well, they don't deserve it. That's right. None of us deserve it. None of us deserve anything that we have. If God was a just God and didn't send Jesus down to die in our place, and he was just a legalistic God, he'd say, every one of you, go to hell. And he would be right and he would be just and he would be holy. But he went beyond that and he said, look, I could send you to hell, But if you will trust in me and believe in me and I will send my son and he will die in your place and I will serve you. And if you will serve others, I mean there's people around here, I told you about the lady down the aisle down here, that's having a tough time,

you know, she needs somebody to love her, somebody to take

care of her. She's alone, she has no family

here. She is, you know, having a really

tough time because of her past. And all of us have tough times.

I mean, there's times that some of y'all are sick, and some of

y'all don't feel good, and some of you can't do. And, you know,

if you know that, help each other out. If you're able to, you know. If nothing else, If you got a

phone, you know, if you can't walk down there at least, you

know, call them on the phone or walk down there and pray with

them, cry with them, do something, you know, just say, I'm here,

I love you, you know, want to serve you, is there anything

I can do for you? And that's the kind of thing

that God wants us to do. It's never been about going to

church. It's never been about doing religious

things. But the heart of the matter is

that God says, if you love God and love your neighbor, then

you fulfill the whole law, right? Because the first four commandments

have to do with loving God, have no other idols, take God's name

in vain, and keep the Sabbath holy, don't make any graven image. But then he says the last six,

you know, honor your father and mother, don't covet, don't steal,

don't lie, don't murder. Those have to do with loving

your people around you, right? And Jesus told that lawyer fellow

that day, he was trying to get out, and he said, well, who's

my neighbor? And Jesus said, your neighbor is anybody that

is in need. Anybody. Not just the person,

you know, what somebody said the other day. I was listening

to somebody the other day that, you know, when people do for you,

and you reciprocate, that's what the world does, right? You go

to lunch and somebody buys lunch and you say, well at least let

me get the tip. Buy you lunch, at least let me get the tip.

Or if they invite you to lunch and then you got to invite them

back to feel like you got even, right? And that's what the world

does is reciprocates, right? But Jesus says, I want you to

love people and go beyond reciprocation. I want you to love them when

they don't deserve it, when they don't think they want it, when

they don't act like they even want you around. You love them

anyway, right? That's what we're supposed to

do. We sing the song, Love Lifted Me, when nothing else would help. Love lifted me, and that's really

the theme song of the ministry that I run called His Love Ministries. This is what I do. I'm not perfect,

but He says that love lifted me when nothing else would help. Love lifted me. So you serve

people. You help people. And so Jesus

is saying, look, if I am God, and I am the teacher, and I have

done this for you, if I, God, can stoop down and wash your

feet. Remember what we said last week about washing feet? John

said that I'm not even worthy to untie the strap of his sandal,

to loose the thongs of his sandal. It was the most menial task.

The slaves did it. The most lowest people did that. And yet here is God of everything,

stooped down on his knees, washing people's nasty dirty feet. And

he says, I have given you an example. And then he says, verse

16, most assuredly. Remember when Jesus says most

assuredly? Some of your Bibles say verily,

verily. Some of them say amen, amen. Some of them say truly,

truly. And remember every time Jesus

says those things, whatever your Bible happens to say, all of

them are good translations. You know what He's saying? He's

saying, listen up folks, what I'm about to say is very important. So you better listen up right

now. And so Jesus says, I say to you, a servant is not greater

than his master, nor is he who is sent greater than he who sent

him. See, God calls each and every

one of us. And yeah, in the eyes of the

world sometimes, a servant is nothing and a master is great. But Jesus says that the ground

is level at the cross, right? That there's no more Jew, no

more Greek, no more male, no more female. That doesn't erase

the distinction of roles of men and women and all these other

things that some people say. But what it does say is that,

look, everybody is somebody in the eyes of God. Everybody is

equal in the eyes of God. He loves all of us. He cares

for all of us. And He says, look, no matter

whether you're the one who was sent, the master, or whether

you're the servant, hey, in the eyes of God, You're the same

to me, because I love you both. And then he says, look what he

says in verse 17, if you know these sayings, blessed are you

if you, what? Do them. You know, Jesus over

and over and over again, remember the Bible talks about James 2.14

to 26, that faith without works is what? Dead, right? What Jesus

says here is the same thing he always says. Why do you call

me Lord, Lord? Do not do the things I say to

do. If you love me, you'll keep my

commandments. And all these things just add

up to the same thing. If you're really truly saved,

guess what? These will be evident in your

life. And you are blessed. Why? What

does Matthew 5 say? Blessed are you if you are persecuted.

Blessed are you if you are humble. Blessed are you if you are reviled

and persecuted. Blessed are those who are meek. Blessed are those who mourn and

seek God. Why are they blessed? They're

blessed because why? They are seeking God. They want

what God has. They're mourning over their sin.

Those are not the way you get into heaven. But those are the

things that show that you are in heaven. Because you mourn

over your sin. You're going to be persecuted. You're going to be mistreated.

You're going to desire the things of God. And blessed means you're

joyful, right? You are getting something out

of it. And you know, I tell people all

the time, the world thinks that going to church and living for

God is no fun. And it is. It is. It's fun. And you know when I

have more fun, doing this and then all the stuff I used to

do before I was saved. I tell folks that all the time.

And I did a lot of wrong things. I tell them, you know, look,

I have way more fun than I used to have. And you know what? It

don't cause me all the pain and the trouble and the sorrow and

all the things that come out of doing wrong. You know, the

Bible says sin is fun for a season. You can play all you want to,

but then somewhere along the line, the bill comes due. Every

time the devil says, come on and get it and have fun, there's

always a hook in it. And that hook will catch you,

right? That old fish thinks he's getting a good shrimp or a good

little old fish or something. And all of a sudden he chomps

down on that thing. What does he got? He's got a hook, right? And that's what the devil does.

He says, come on, have a little fun. You know, I can give you satisfaction.

I can give you joy. I can give you all those things.

But you don't have to serve that old God who's a tyrant. And he's

holding out on you. He don't want you to have all

the real fun. But as soon as you chalked down on it, he said,

I got you. And then you find out that what

you did is going to cost you. One person put it this way, said

it'll take you further than you want to go, take you longer, keep you longer than you wanted to stay, and cost you more than you ever wanted to pay. But see, blessed are you if you do these things, because see, When you do, that proves to the world that you are who you said you are. Because you can't fake living for God. You can for a little while. But you know what happens? Eventually, it comes out. Like old Abraham Lincoln says, you can fool some people some of the time, but you can't fool all the people all the time. You can't fool God at all. He knows everything. He told them folks that it was coming after the bread. They said the next day they were seeking him after he fed the 15 or 20,000 people with the loaves and the fishes. He said, look, you're not seeking me because you want me. You're seeking me because you ate the loaves and the fishes and were filled. You're not seeking me for the right reason. And see, God knows, and we can fake people out for a little while. Some people go to church and they dress up nice and they look all pretty, but down inside, they've never been changed. And when you're changed, yes, you still have a hard time sometimes, and sometimes you still do some of the things you used to do, and yeah, we all sin, but you know what? We still have it way better than those that are living for the world. We're just getting a taste of heaven on this side of earth. Jesus says basically what the lessons of this storm will guit here today. The lessons are is Jesus wants you to wash His feet today by serving His people. Did you know that? You serve His people and when you serve His people, you serve Jesus. Now if Jesus were to come in here, we'd all line up to wash Jesus' feet. But if somebody down the hallway or somebody off the street or one of the staff or somebody come in, we might think two or three times

or a bunch of times or just walk out, right? So humility involves serving others, not just the Lord. I mean, if the Lord could say He humbled Himself and became obedient to death, even the death of the cross, hung naked on that cross, was spit on, mocked, mistreated, washed the disciples' feet, what aren't we to do? And then joy not only comes from learning about humility. See, a lot of people know this book. They know the Word of God, but they have never put it into practice. It's not just about how much scripture that you have out here, but how much is coming out from here. Yes, we'll always know more than we practice. You know, the bad thing about being a preacher, I heard one man say that the bad thing about being a preacher is my wife expects me to live up to my sermons every week. None of us can live up to this word perfectly. But you know what? Through the power of God, Paul said, I can do all things. I don't know if there's anybody in here, probably everybody in here knows the Lord. But if you don't, Jesus wants to wash your feet today. He wants to save you and forgive you and change you from the inside out. Like I said, I know a lot of people go to different churches and unfortunately Not every church teaches the true gospel that Jesus died in our place. He died for our sins. He was buried. He rose again the third day. And if you trust in that and nothing else to get you to heaven, you make it. That's called faith, right? God said it. I believe it. That's faith. But some people think well I got to add this and I got to add that and I got to add something else. You know what that is? That's what Peter had. He had

pride, right? Pride is saying I can add something

to what God did to get into heaven. God says look. I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one gets to the Father but by me. In other words, there's no other way to get there. When he said it is finished on the cross, he meant he did everything that was necessary for us to go to heaven. There was nothing left to do. I told you all before, if I painted everything on that wall and left one little old spot the size of a pinhead, it's not finished, right? But Jesus said it was finished. It was complete. It was done. And we need to believe that. We need to trust in that. And some of you maybe sometimes doubt. I ask people sometimes, are you going to heaven? And they say, well, I hope so. didn't die so that you might hope so. He died that you would know so. Because John wrote that book, 1 John, also. He wrote this book, John, the book of John, to say that you might believe and believe and you might have life in His name. But then he wrote 1 John and he says in John, 1 John chapter 5 verse 13, he says, I wrote these things that you might know that you have eternal life. And you know you have eternal life because you've put your faith in a Savior. And then you've seen the evidence of the way God's changed you from the inside out. And that you can serve people. You can pray for people who curse you and despitefully use you. And you can do things for people that don't deserve it. Because you realize that none of us do. Well, let's pray and we'll close today. Father, we love you, we thank you, and we thank you that when there was no way, that you made a way, that you sent your son Jesus to die on the cross for our sins. And you said that no one gets to the Father but by you. You said that it is not a works,

lest anyone should boast. So Lord, I pray for many folks probably that haven't come to this service and don't come to this service that they would come and realize that you are the only way to make it to heaven. It's not works, it's not communion, it's not baptism, but it is grace. Through faith, it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast. Father, help someone here today, if anybody in here is not trusting in you, to cry out and say, Lord Jesus, save me. And then trusting in that, because you said, whoever calls on your name shall be saved. And we thank you for that. In Jesus' name, amen. Hi, I'm Marty McKenzie with His Love Ministries.
