Intro: What is the *way* to the only comfort in life and death? (Rom. 10:1-13)

A. It is not the (*Jewish*) way of bringing in your own righteousness (vs. 3-7)

B. It is submitting (trust and confess) to Christ's righteousness (vs. 8-13)

THE COMMITMENT OF OUR LORD AS OUR REDEEMER

I. What was His commitment? II. What did He do commit to do to redeem us?

I. What was His commitment?

A. God directs us to *Jesus' commitment* in vs. 7 (see Ps. 40)

1. 'volume of the book' is not one particular book (Gill)

2. our focus is more on *what is written of Him* in Ps. 40

B. Jesus' Commitment: *His action in response to God!*

1. His commitment is not *based on right circumstances*

2. His commitment is rooted *in His love to His Father: Ps. 40:8*

3. His commitment is center or heart of a *real relationship* (Gen. 2:24)

B. Reflection: *Examine our Christianity with regard to our commitment*

II. WHAT DID HE COMMIT TO DO TO REDEEM US?

A. He committed to *buy us free* from curse we deserved for our sin

1. Hebrews 10:1-4 remind nothing **we** sacrifice could take away sins

2. Hebrews 10:5-10 reveals that a better offering is provided in Jesus Christ

3. Hebrews 10:12-14 reveals Jesus' supremacy as Lord upon His obedience

B. He committed to *make us free from* actual bondage of Satan/sin (vs. 15-18)

1. In vs. 10, 14 apostle refers to *sanctified* which is explained in vs. 15-18

a. regeneration is His first act of sanctification: *delivered us from the power of Satan **personally*** (Romans 6:11-13)

b. in His final coming Jesus the LORD will *deliver us from presence of Satan's power **eternally*** (vs. 13)

Living the truth ...

A. Jesus was committed to His Father and to His people

B. Are we committed to our Lord and His people?
