Exodus 20:3

Exclusive Devotion to Yahweh

"You shall have no other gods before me."

1. It Is Our Duty to Delight Exclusively in Yahweh as Our God.

A. What Does This Require?

B. What Does This Forbid?

2. There Is No One As Captivatingly Desirable as Yahweh.

3. It Requires Faith to Believe in a Beauty We Cannot See.

CONCLUSION: How do we know what it means to love God faithfully? He tells us in His Word by what He *requires* and by what He *forbids*. He also woos us to Himself revealing His beauty, majesty, and matchless wonder. But not only are there countless competing suiters for the affection we owe only to Yahweh, the Deceiver constantly bombards us with false accusations about God. We must trust *what God has said as true* and give Him all the praise He is due.

Westminster Larger Catechism

Q. 104. What are the *duties* **required** in the first commandment?

A. The duties required in the first commandment are, (1) the *knowing* and *acknowledging* of God to be the *only true God*, and *our* God; (2) and to *worship* and *glorify* him accordingly, by thinking, meditating, remembering, highly esteeming, honoring, adoring, choosing, loving, desiring, fearing of him; (3) *believing* him; (4) *trusting*, hoping, delighting, rejoicing in him; (5) *being zealous* for him; (6) *calling* upon him; (7) *giving all praise* and thanks, and yielding all obedience and submission to him with the whole man; (8) being careful in all things to *please him*, and sorrowful when in anything he is offended; (9) and *walking humbly* with him.

Q. 105. What are the *sins* **forbidden** in the first commandment?

A. The sins forbidden in the first commandment are (1) *atheism*, in denying, or not having a God; (2) *idolatry*, in having or worshiping more gods than one, or any with, or instead of the true God; (3) the not having and avouching him for God, and our God; (4) the omission or neglect of anything due to him, required this commandment; (5) ignorance, forgetfulness, in misapprehensions, false opinions, unworthy and wicked thoughts of him; (6) bold and curious searching into his secrets; (7) all profaneness, hatred of God; (8) self-love, self-seeking, and all other inordinate and immoderate setting of our mind, will, or affections upon other things, and taking them off from him in whole or in part; (9) vain credulity, unbelief, heresy, misbelief, distrust, despair, incorrigibleness, and insensibleness under judgments; (10) hardness of heart; pride; presumption; carnal security; tempting of God; (11) using unlawful means, and trusting in lawful means; (12) carnal delights and joys; (13) corrupt, blind, and *indiscreet zeal*; (14) *lukewarmness*, and deadness in the things of God; (15) *estranging ourselves*, and apostatizing from God; (16) praying, or giving any religious worship, to saints, angels, or any other creatures; (17) all compacts and consulting with the devil, and hearkening to his suggestions; (18) making men the lords of our faith and conscience; (19) slighting and despising God and his commands; (20) resisting and grieving of his Spirit, discontent and impatience at his dispensations, charging him foolishly for the evils he inflicts on us; (21) and *ascribing* the praise of any good we either are, have, or can do, to fortune, idols, ourselves, or any other creature.

Taking Gathered Worship Home

Exclusivity is at the heart of God's commitment to His people. It is the prime directive, the essential core. Going steady doesn't mean anything, if it is not exclusive. There is not only *no room at all for playing the field with other gods*, but God is due ALL worship, praise, devotion, and adoration.

Sunday Morning

READ Exodus 20:1-21; Psalm 14:1; 81:1-16; 29:1-11; First Thessalonians 1:2-9; Deuteronomy 26:16-19; Matthew 4:10; Isaiah 45:22-25; Philippians 2:4-11. DISCUSS What does it mean to be exclusive with God? What does it mean for Him to be exclusively ours? MEDITATE on Exodus 20:3. Use WLC #104-5 as an aid. PRAY "Yahweh, You alone are God. Teach us to honor You exclusively as God."

Sunday Evening

Monday

READ **Exodus 20:1-21**; **6:2-8**; **Psalm 14:1**; **First Thessalonians 1:2-9**; **Deuteronomy 26:16-19**. DISCUSS We all know that there is a god. If we follow Christ, we have turned from idols to serve Him alone. Why? Why is it necessary to serve Christ only if we are to serve Him at all? SERVE by taking time to help someone! MEDITATE on **Exodus 20:3**. Use WLC #104-5 as an aid. PRAY, "Yahweh, we long to be done with giving others the praise only You deserve. Give us hearts united to adore You alone."

Tuesday

READ Exodus 20:1-21; Psalm 81:1-16; Deuteronomy 26:16-19; Matthew 4:10. DISCUSS Why is listening to God imperative to worshipping Him? MEDITATE on Exodus 20:3. Use WLC #104-5 as an aid. PRAY, "Yahweh, You are *our* God. There is no one but You. Teach us to live out that reality. Make us faithful to You as You are faithful to us. Receive our worship in Christ. Make us loyal and joyful in our adoration of You as our only God."

Wednesday

READ **Exodus 20:1-21; Psalm 29:1-11; Matthew 4:10; Isaiah 45:22-25**. DISCUSS What do you find most alluring about God? When/How are you most likely to forget that? MEDITATE on **Exodus 20:3**. Use WLC #104-5 as an aid. PRAY, "Yahweh, God of the covenant, You are full of majesty. You alone can forgive. Heal us of our idolatrous hearts. Make us faithful!"

Thursday

READ Exodus 20:1-21; Psalm 14:1; Isaiah 45:22-25; Philippians 2:4-11. DISCUSS How does Jesus fulfill all of this first word/teaching? How do you need to repent for ways you have not done what you should/done what you should not? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on Exodus 20:3. Use WLC #104-5 as an aid. PRAY, "Jesus, You are worthy of all praise, honor, and devotion. Help us to joyfully and exclusively give all of it to You."

Friday

READ Exodus 20:1-21; Psalm 14:1; 81:1-16; 29:1-11; First Thessalonians 1:2-9; Deuteronomy 26:16-19; Matthew 4:10; Isaiah 45:22-25; Philippians 2:4-11. DISCUSS What has God been teaching you this week? SERVE by *caring for someone in need*! MEDITATE on MEDITATE on Exodus 20:3. Use WLC #104-5 as an aid. PRAY that we at FCCW would *trust Christ together*.

Saturday

PREPARE today for gathered Sunday worship tomorrow. CONSIDER Why has God called us to gather with God's people tomorrow? READ Exodus 20:1-21. Invite others to join you tomorrow for the worship service @ 10:30 am. PRAY, "Lord, gather us together to delight in You."
