Colossians 4:2-18 OT: Psalm 17

Theme: The fruit of our deepening understanding of the riches of God's grace and our probing of the mysteries of the gospel revealed in Christ Jesus, is a greater love for one another in the church, and a deeper love and desire for those "outside" to know the hope of eternal life and the joy of salvation in Christ.

Background: In Colossians we have had deep, rich theology revealed. We have explored the implications of the mystery of Christ in us; we have seen the application of our new life in Christ; and now we are brought to the fruit of that theology and life in Christ.

Introduction: Want to make Christians fell guilty and ashamed? Talk about prayer or witnessing. Three things I hope to accomplish today:

- 1. Spur us on in prayer without shame or guilt
- 2. Assuage some of our guilt over our "witness"
- 3. Show that sound theology leads to Christian love
- Steadfast Prayer
  - A. A natural response (4:2)
    - 1. With thanksgiving for His Word
    - 2. Life reordered!
      - Despair to hope
      - alienated reconciled
      - condemned forgiven
      - dead in sin alive in Christ
  - B. The call to prayer an invitation!
    - 1. Continue steadfastly ("devoted" Acts 1:14; 2:42; 6:4; Romans 12:12)
      - This is a privilege! (1:3&9)
      - It is not impossible Paul at Prayer (1:9)
    - 2. Being watchful
      - a. Actually being awake!
      - b. Alert to what is happening, and what is going to happen
        - He is preparing for his return (3:4)
        - Alert to the realities of Christ's work
      - c. Jesus said "Stay awake" (Mark 13:35-37; Matthew 24:42)
    - 3. With thanksgiving!
      - A pervasive theme in this letter! (1:3&4; 1:12; 2:7; 3:15-17; 4:2)
  - C. The plea for prayer
    - 1. For himself and those who served with him?
    - 2. For open doors
      - Not prison doors but doors that imprison
    - 3. The mystery of Christ made known (1:27; 2:2)
    - 4. Clear speech (1:28&29)
      - Not caught up in speculative questions/issues
      - 1 Corinthians 2:2
  - D. Gospel Labor (Epaphras; 4:12&13)
    - Working hard for you in his prayers!

You don't need to feel guilty to pray well. You need to be thankful if you will learn to pray!

- II. Ready to Share?
  - A. The tension

- 1. Biblically
  - One side: The Great Commission (Matthew 28:19&20; 2 Corinthians 4:13)
  - Other side: Pray for evangelists. But it is hard pressed to find a passage telling all believers they are to be evangelists
- 2. Personally?
  - I can't hide my faith
  - Approaching strangers is really tough
- B. Our walk (Literally, "walk in wisdom") (4:5)
  - Walk in a manner worthy of the Lord (1:10)
  - 1. In wisdom
    - Walking in the knowledge of God's will (1:9)
    - Not bending to the ways and ideas of the world
  - 2. Toward "outsiders" (1 Corinthians 5:12&13; 1 Thessalonians 4:12; 1 Timothy 3:7)
    - A distinction between those "inside" the church and those "outside"
  - 3. Using time wisely
    - Sense of urgency time is in short supply
- C. Our witness
  - 1. Our speech
    - It is not just "gracious" speech (i.e. "polite")
    - Our speech with "outsiders" should be "grace-full"!
  - 2. Seasoned with salt!
  - 3. How you answer
    - a. A Significant distinction:
      - Paul "how I ought to speak"
      - Them "how you ought to answer each person" (1 Peter 3:15&16)
    - b. Significant opportunities
      - Can't remove all responsibility
      - Paul clearly believed there would be lots of opportunities

## III. A Bond of Love

- An intimate bond is established between Paul and the Colossians

## IV. The Word Remains

- The "richest of fare" (Isaiah 55:2) in the depth of the riches of the knowledge of God's work in Christ, has brought forth the deepest of love
- Let your study of God's Word and truth bear the fruit of a faithful walk and sweetest of fellowship resulting, most naturally, in great thanksgiving!
