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Comparison of Moses to Jesus in Hebrews 3:1-6

1. Moses was an apostle; Jesus was The Apostle.
2. Moses was faithful and received glory; Jesus was more faithful and receives more glory.
3. Moses represented the house of God; Jesus built the house of God.
4. Moses was a servant in God's house; Jesus is the one over God's House.
5. Moses served as a forerunner to the High Priest; Jesus is the last High Priest.
6. Moses was a type/shadow; Jesus was the fulfillment/real.
7. Moses was a servant of God; Jesus was the Son of God.
8. Moses prophesied about the Christ; Jesus is the Christ.

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How do you know if you are in God's House?

A continuance in a right consideration,
confession, confidence, and hope in Jesus Christ.

Hebrews

1. Hebrews 3:1 tells us to “consider Jesus.” What do you think the author means by this instruction to his readers?
2. It is still worthwhile, but do you believe that it is easier to consider Jesus as you have accumulated more knowledge of about the person and work of Jesus Christ?
3. While you are considering Christ, look back over Hebrews 1-3:6 and see what positions or titles of Jesus have been mentioned thus far and list them. You may want to reflect back on these as you personally consider Jesus this week.
4. Both Hebrews 2, and 3 begin with “Therefore.” Look back over the preceding passages before “therefore” is mentioned, and give a brief summation of what they are there for.
5. Read Philippians 3:12-21 as Paul talks about the upward call and how the call should affect the entire journey. What are some differences that he brings up that mark a different ending and pathway for Christians as compared to the world?
6. How can we fight against the common, but wrong, belief confessing Jesus as our Savior, living in sin, and expecting to arrive in heaven?
7. What similarity do you find in Philippians 3:16 and Hebrews 3:6? If so, what is it?
