Acts 11: 1 - 18

Now the apostles and the brothers who were throughout Judea heard that the Gentiles also had received the word of God. ² So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcision party criticized him, saying, 3 "You went to uncircumcised men and ate with them." ⁴But Peter began and explained it to them in order: 5 "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision, something like a great sheet descending, being let down from heaven by its four corners, and it came down to me. ⁶ Looking at it closely, I observed animals and beasts of prey and reptiles and birds of the air. ⁷ And I heard a voice saying to me, 'Rise, Peter; kill and eat.' ⁸ But I said, 'By no means, Lord; for nothing common or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But the voice answered a second time from heaven, 'What God has made clean, do not call common.' 10 This happened three times, and all was drawn up again into heaven. 11 And behold, at that very moment three men arrived at the house in which we were, sent to me from Caesarea. ¹² And the Spirit told me to go with them, making no distinction. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. ¹³ And he told us how he had seen the angel stand in his house and say, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon who is called Peter; ¹⁴he will declare to you a message by which you will be saved, you and all your household.' 15 As I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell on them just as on us at the beginning. 16 And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' ¹⁷ If then God gave the same gift to them as he gave to us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could stand in God's way?" 18 When they heard these things they fell silent. And they glorified God, saying, "Then to the Gentiles also God has granted repentance that leads to life."

Morning Worship Service:

Acts 11: 1 – 18

Concerning Gentile Believers in Christ

1.	The Complaint:	You Shared	Fellowship	with (Gentiles ((1-3).	

2. Peter's Explanation: God Sent Me and Validated It (4-16).

3. **Conclusion**: Gratitude to God for His Mercy (17-18).

Peter returned to Jerusalem rejoicing in the Holy Spirit's work through his ministry in ushering in Gentiles into the family of God. Yet when he arrived he received criticism instead of shared celebration. By God's grace Peter was able to respond humbly to the detractors and answered their critiques by careful explanation of both God's direct command and the Holy Spirit's confirmation. As a result the entire gathering of Christ-followers in Jerusalem was able to rejoice together at the mercy of God revealed through the addition of the Gentiles to the family of God.

Isaiah 30: 15 - 22

- For thus said the Lord GOD, the Holy One of Israel, "In returning and rest you shall be saved; in quietness and in trust shall be your strength." But you were unwilling, ¹⁶ and you said, "No! We will flee upon horses"; therefore you shall flee away; and, "We will ride upon swift steeds"; therefore your pursuers shall be swift.
 A thousand shall flee at the threat of one; at the threat of five you shall flee, till you are left like a flagstaff on the top of a mountain, like a signal on a hill.
- Therefore the LORD waits to be gracious to you, and therefore he exalts himself to show mercy to you. For the LORD is a God of justice; blessed are all those who wait for him.

¹⁹ For a people shall dwell in Zion, in Jerusalem; you shall weep no more. He will surely be gracious to you at the sound of your cry. As soon as he hears it, he answers you. ²⁰ And though the Lord give you the bread of adversity and the water of affliction, yet your Teacher will not hide himself anymore, but your eyes shall see your Teacher. ²¹ And your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying, "This is the way, walk in it," when you turn to the right or when you turn to the left. ²² Then you will defile your carved idols overlaid with silver and your gold-plated metal images. You will scatter them as unclean things. You will say to them, "Be gone!"

Acts—Series Overview

The Expansion of the Gospel Witness with Power

Acts records God's faithful accomplishment of all that He promised in taking the gospel to the nations. It lays the groundwork for all that will take place as His Church awaits His return. Taking Gathered Worship Home

Criticism. No one likes getting it. But being totally accepted by God through Christ frees us to hear other people's concerns and respond with grace and truth rather than becoming defensive. Peter shows us in this week's passage and points us to what God alone is able to work in us—repentance unto life.

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

Sunday Morning

READ Acts 11:1-18; Isaiah 30:15-22; Ephesians 4:14-16. DISCUSS, What's significant about the Gentiles receiving the Word? Why did the Holy Spirit fall upon them? What did that signify? Why were they baptized instead of circumcised? Why do the Jewish believers praise God for granting them repentance to life? PRAY "Lord King, we praise You for Your mercy. Thank You for extending Your grace to us and enfolding us fully in Your loving family."

Sunday Evening

Monday

READ Acts 11:1-18; Romans 6:3-11; Psalm 51:1-19. DISCUSS, What does repentance unto life mean? Why does Scripture talk about it in such bold terms as life and death? How much do you hate your sin? What are you doing to trust Christ in dealing with your sin? PRAY, "Jesus, You're worthy of all praise, glory, & honor. Make us joyfully give it all to You!"

Tuesday

READ Acts 11:1-18; Second Corinthians 5:16-21. DISCUSS, How are repentance and reconciliation related? How are they at work in you (us)? How are you praising God for the repentance He has granted you (us)? PRAY, "Jesus, thank You for revealing our sin to us. Thank You for enabling us to hate it and turn to You for life. We love You and ask that You would embolden us to love You more."

Wednesday

READ Acts 11:1-18; Colossians 3:5-11; Joel 2:12-14. DISCUSS, How are we to deal with our sin? What does it mean to treat our "old self" as dead? How do we return to the Lord with all our heart? How did God work this in Cornelius and his household? PRAY, "Lord, forgive us for our rebellion against You. Thank You for your mercy and grace."

Thursday

READ **Acts 11:1-18**; **Romans 8:12-17**; DISCUSS, How did the Holy Spirit "testify" in both of these passages? What is the significance in each? How is He testifying concerning you? How? PRAY, "Lord, thank You for giving us Your Holy Spirit and for His work in our lives. Make us bold as witnesses for You."

Friday

READ Acts 11:1-18; Isaiah 30:15-22; Ephesians 4:14-16. DISCUSS, How has God been teaching you from these passages this week? REJOICE if God has granted you the gift of faith in Christ! PRAY for renewal and revival across our land.

Saturday

PREPARE today for the worship service tomorrow. *There will be both live-stream and in-person services available*.

READ **Acts 11:1-30**. Invite others to join you for either the *live-stream or in-person service* tomorrow. Ask Jesus to help us love our neighbors well.
