The Vanity of Pleasure

Ecclesiastes 2:1-11

- I. THE PROMISE OF PLEASURE (1-11; 1 Cor 15:32)—sensuality, hedonism
 - A. <u>Laughter</u> (2)—making fun, looking to comedy to cope, distract
 - 1. A spontaneous response of delight
 - **2. An intentional distraction** from drudgery, anxiety or sadness
 - 3. A deliberate response to a perceived threat
 - <u>defiant</u>—mocking, trivializing; express dominance, bravado
 - <u>avoidant</u>—laugh it off, pretend it's a joke to avoid a fight
 - <u>cynical</u>—passive aggressive response to life, conscious irony
 - **B.** Alcohol (3; Ps 104:15; Pr 20:1)—a drug to manipulate your feelings
 - 1. The Connoisseur—sophisticated, snob
 - 2. The Alcoholic—inebriated, drunk
 - **C.** <u>Projects</u> (4-6; 1 Cor 15:58)—building mansions and landscaping; creating and ruling
 - 1. For Personal Enjoyment—my own house and yard
 - **2. For Community Enjoyment**—something beautiful for everyone to enjoy
 - **3. For Enduring Fame**—historical monument to his glory
 - **D.** <u>Slaves</u> (7a)—command, manpower to do his bidding; my will be done!
 - E. Food (7b; Mat 4:4; Jn 6:35)—the best and a lot; a sensual pleasure
 - 1. The Epicurean—only the best food
 - 2. The Glutton—overindulgence

- **F.** <u>Money</u> (8a; Mat 6:24; Tim 6:10)—silver, gold, financial investments; security, control, power to accomplish your goals
- G. Music (8b; 1 Sam 16:23)—entertainment, soothing, inspiring, etc...
- H. <u>Sex</u> (8c)—a harem of concubines; physical ecstasy, prowess, relational worship
- II. THE EMPTINESS OF HEDONISM—doesn't satisfy, won't last
 - A. It is futile to pursue pleasure for its own sake on our own terms.
 - **B.** There is no satisfaction apart from God. His gifts were meant to be enjoyed in relationship with Him.
 - **C.** <u>Good things cannot be ultimate things</u>. They will crumble under the weight of our idolatrous expectation.
- III. THE WITNESS OF PLEASURE—calls us to Jesus
 - **A.** <u>God is good</u>. (Ps 34:8). We were designed for pleasure. He wants to share His joy with us.
 - **B.** Pleasure is a <u>reminder</u> of what we lost in Eden. (Gen 3; Rom 8:18-23). *The world is broken. Something went terribly wrong.*
 - 1. God created perfection.
 - 2. Sin ruined everything.
 - 3. The evidence remains.
 - **C.** Pleasure is a <u>promise</u> of what is yet to come. (Ps 16:11; Pr 10:28; Mat 25:21) There is joy now but the best is yet to come.
