

"On this marble pillar at Bergama (Pergamum) we see three health symbols..."



Hislop, The Two Babylons (1862):

"In Pergamos, and in all Asia Minor, from which directly Rome derived its knowledge of the mysteries, the case was the same. In Pergamos, especially, where pre-eminently 'Satan's seat was,' the sun-divinity, as is well known, was worshipped under the form of a serpent and under the name of Esculapius, 'the man-instructing serpent.""



"The Greek form of this name, Asklepios, signifies simply 'the instructing snake'..."

"Lactantius was led to the conclusion that the Esculapian serpent was the express symbol of Satan..."

Revelation 12:9 And the great dragon was cast out, that old serpent, called the Devil, and Satan, which deceiveth the whole world...

Arch Iran Med (2020 Aug 1):

"The two most renowned snake symbols used in medicine are the rod of Asclepius and the staff of Hermes or Caduceus..."

"Asclepius is the Greek god of medicine, while Hermes from the ancient Greek Pantheon, is the god of commerce, trade and merchants, as well as the protector of tricksters and thieves. Another less popular duty of Hermes was that of guiding the departed souls to Hades, the underworld..." "In ancient Babylon, the single serpent depicted the great earth snake, the primal embodiment of the mother goddess..."

"The earliest type of Caduceus is found in ancient Babylonian cylinder seals. It constituted a sexual symbol with one male and one female head attached to a single body..."

"It also appears on the libation vase of King Gudea (c. 2100 BCE).... The symbol comprised of two snakes entwined around a rod...and represented Ningishzida, the 'righthand scepter god.' Ningishzida was the 'Herald of the Earth'...''

"In ancient Egypt, there is evidence of an existing relationship between the snake and healing..."

"...the ancestor of the Greek Hermes was the Babylonian Ningishzida..."

"Hermes was a pre-Olympian god and the proto-Hermes was a snake god. He was a dual snake, incorporating both sexes..." "For this reason, the emblem of the god was the Caduceus...a pair of snakes entwined around a wand or scepter..."

"The first report of Asclepius is found in Homer's Iliad (1200–850 BCE). He was a king and had two sons..."

"After 420 BCE, Asclepius was raised to an Olympian god."



"In 293 BCE, a plague had corrupted Rome. The Roman sought advice from the Apollo's oracle at Delphi, where they were instructed to seek help from Asclepius..."

"The god, in the shape of a huge serpent...went to Rome and eradicated the plague..."

"The cult of Asclepius survived for 1000 years, from 5th century BCE to 5th century CE, until it was bitterly attacked as Christianity gained in popularity."

"The Caduceus gradually became the symbol of alchemy and pharmacy. This association dates back to the 2nd century CE or even earlier, from reports found in the Hermetica texts, mentioning the great influence that the planet Mercury (Hermes) has on Earth..."

"Mercury/Hermes prevailed in alchemy and by the 16th century, the Caduceus had turned into a symbol of medicine and drugs..."

"The rod of Asclepius was used by]...the American Medical Association in 1910...,while the caduceus appeared in the US Army Medical Corps in 1856...and the US Air Medical Corps in 1902...After that, a lot of medical organizations followed."

Churches of Asia (1895):

"We have already seen that amid the leading pagan deities who had their headquarters in the several cities of the seven churches, that of Esculapius was in Pergamos..."

"...seated upon a throne, in one hand holding a staff or pole around which was wreathed a serpent, the other hand resting upon the head of a serpent..."

"This pagan deity Esculapius had his metropolis, his capital, his headquarters, in Pergamos. He was the...deity of the city. So fully was he identified with it that a common epithet by which he was designated was Pergamos Deus. According to heathen phraseology, he was the guardian deity of the place."

"In Pergamos was his most magnificent temple...His was the national religion..." "Serpent-worship was the chief element in the rites and ceremonies of this deity. Esculapius was always worshiped in the form of a snake. In his temples a serpent wreathed around a staff was his invariable symbol."

Cyclopaedia of Biblical, Theological, and Ecclesiastical Literature (1877):

"Now there was at Pergamos a celebrated and much frequented temple of Aesculapius...called the god of Pergamos...on the coins struck by the town Aesculapius appears with a rod encircled by a serpent..."

"The medical symbol of serpents wrapped around a staff is a familiar one in the field, decorating pharmaceutical packaging and hospitals alike..."

Missouri Medicine, 2019 Nov-Dec;

"Aesculapius was the god of medicine and was the son of Apollo, the god of healing...The Staff of Aesculapius is a rough-hewn branch representing plants and growth entwined by a single snake. Aesculapius was known as the god of medicine."

"Hermes (Mercury) was the messenger of the gods and known for carrying a staff known as the Caduceus. The caduceus included two snakes topped off with a set of wings..." "It was believed that Hippocrates was a direct descendant of Aesculapius. Hopefully, most of you know the Hippocratic Oath begins with the words 'I swear by Apollo, the physician, and by Aesculapius'..."

"...Medical Associations in Asia, India, Canada, Great Britain, France, Germany, Africa, and Scandinavia all share the Staff of Aesculapius..."

"The U.S. Army Medical Corps and the U.S. Navy Medical Corps still use the caduceus with the two snakes. The U.S Air Force Medical Service uses the Staff of Aesculapius with one snake..."

"The New England Journal of Medicine, The American College of Physicians, and the World Health Organization use the Staff of Aesculapius." **AT Wiley, Asclepios, M.D.? The Ancient Greeks** and Integrative Medicine (2013):

"...Pergamon's Asclepieion was founded in the early 4th century BC...Worship continued at this healing complex until it was destroyed by an earthquake between 253 and 260 AD, but not rebuilt..."

"In his Sacred Tales, Aristides describes visiting the Asclepieion at Pergamon with a growth in his abdomen: 'At this point, the doctors cried out all sorts of things, some said surgery, some said cauterization by drug, or that an infection would arise and I must surely die. But the god [Asclepios] gave a contrary opinion and told me to endure and foster the growth...'"

J Pharm Bioallied Sci. 2015 Apr; 7:

"Things you don't learn in medical school: **Caduceus...Being in the medical profession** for so many years, have we ever thought what that symbol that we wear on our coats, print on our prescription pads and textbooks, stand for?"

"If you observe closely there are two symbols that are used to represent medicine...One is the Caduceus, and the other is the Rod of Asclepius. Caduceus is a symbol with a short staff entwined by two serpents, sometimes surmounted by wings while the Rod of Asclepius is the one with a single snake."

"The Caduceus is a symbol of Hermes or Mercury in Greek and **Roman mythology...The Rod of** Asclepius belongs to Aesculapius, who was the revered Greek god of healing..."

"The modern use of staff of Aesculapius started when The **American Medical Association had the staff of Aesculapius** as its symbol in 1910. The Royal Army Medical Corp, **French** Military Service, and other medical organizations had done the same. Even today the World Health **Organization, Medical Council of India symbols have the** staff of Aesculapius in them. US Army Medical Corps, the **Public Health Service, and the US Marine Hospital** however use the Caduceus largely as a result of the adoption of the Caduceus as its insignia by the US Army Medical Corps in 1902..."

"In 1990, a survey was done in the US and it was found that 62% of the professional associations used the Rod of Aesculapius while 37% used the Caduceus and 76% of commercial organizations used the Caduceus..."

"...the answer lies deep sown in history when Moses, around 1400 BC, used the bronze serpent erected on the pole to cure the people who were bitten by snakes...? [???]

"WHO's emblem was chosen by the First World Health Assembly in 1948. The emblem consists of the United Nations symbol surmounted by a staff with a snake coiling round it."

"The staff with the snake has long been a symbol of medicine and the medical profession. It originates from the story of Asclepius, who was revered by the ancient Greeks as a god of healing and whose cult involved the use of snakes."
