The Gloria Patri's first line was sung in the church as early as the 2nd century to affirm that God is Triune. The second line was added in the 4th century to emphasize the eternal Deity of Jesus, refuting the Arian heresy that Jesus was not eternally God.

CMPC Sermon Notes for September 6, 2020

Message: *"We Need Endurance" (Psalm 129)*

Pastor Dee Hammond

- Making our way in the world today takes everything we've got
 - Interesting, disturbing, or a train wreck?
 - A glimpse into 2020 for the people of God (2 Corinthians 4.8-10)
 - We need endurance to run (or walk) the Amazing Race of the Christian life

- The Context – Why did God give us Psalm 129?
 - The Songs of Ascent (120-134)
 - Ascending – a physical journey & a spiritual journey
 - Psalm 120.5-7 – the people of God long for peace, but they dwell in places of war
 - A recalibration for those who live for God

- ***We Need Endurance When the Wicked Won't Let Up*** (vs. 1-2)
 - Remembering the past – just surviving
 - Israel with grey hair
 - We currently live in a world that is increasingly growing hostile against us
 - Persecuted, but protected... let us count the ways
 - Today we have the promise of 2 Timothy 3.12
 - Our afflictions – tortured long and hard (vs. 3)
 - They have NOT prevailed against us!

- ***We Need Endurance to Trust The Lord*** (vs. 5-8)
 - Draw the line
 - Deuteronomy 7.6-11; John 15.18-19
 - An Imprecatory psalm? (calling down of divine judgment on the enemies of God)
 - Genesis 12.1-3
 - Can I ride the fence?
 - All who hate Zion
 - Like withered grass & dry land that yields no harvest
 - Without the blessing of the Lord, without the provision of the Lord
 - Cancel Culture?

- We need endurance to trust the Lord to stand as believers in the midst of great persecution, and to bring the wicked to their knees

➤ ***Where We Find the Endurance We Need*** (vs. 4)

- *"The Lord is righteous"*
 - A relationship – He will hold us fast
 - John 16.33
- Not only has God cut the cords of the plow for us, but God has willingly offered His own back, His own Son, to endure His wrath for the sins of the world
 - Isaiah 53.4-6 (this is the gospel of grace!)
 - Our peace, our hope, our endurance
