## 1. The Blessed Hope and the Final State (v 1).

- **A.** Understanding the intermediate and the final state (see WCF 32.I<sup>-</sup>3).
- **B.** Heaven and the earth passed away (Acts 17:31; Gen 7:19-23; 2 Pt 3:11-13).
- C. The sea no more in the new heaven and earth
  - 1) Not that there is an absence of water (22:1)
  - 2) Rather this (as with most of the book of Revelation) is an symbolic unveiling of the consummation of the covenant of grace, which provide to the church a number of comforts:
    - **a)** Understood within the context of Revelation itself (G. K. Beale, *The Book of Revelation: A Commentary on the Greek Text*, p. 1042)
    - **b)** Understood within the context of biblical theology (a key principle of which is that eschatology is found in protology):
      - i. There is a return to pre-diluvian [meaning, as in before the flood] state (Gen 1:9-10, 7:11, 10:25, 11:9; Rev 21:24).
      - **ii.** To emphasize to us the immanence, or nearness, of God to His glorified creatures. (Gen 1:6-8; Rev 21:23)
- **D.** The new heaven and new earth (I Cor 15:44; Jn 20:19-20; Lk 24:37-43; I Jn 3:2)

## 11. The Church Triumphant in Glory (vv 2-4).

- **A.** The Church triumphant as the Bride of Christ (Rev 21:2b, 21:9, 19:6-10; I Cor II:7, 9)
- **B.** The Church triumphant as the New Jerusalem (v 2a)
  - 1) The holy city and dwelling place of God (v 3a; 2 Chr 2:6; Lk 15:17-18)

  - 2) The entire undoing of the curse (v 4; 1 Cor 15:25-26, 55; Rev 21:8; Isa 35:10; Jn 11:23-25; 1 Thes 4:13; Mt 13:42).

## 111. The Offer, Hope and Warning of the Gospel (vv 5-8).

  - 1) We have comfort in the Ascension of Christ (Jn 14:1-3)
  - 2) We have great comfort in the Return of Christ (v 1; Rev 1:9; Phil 1:21-23).
  - 3) Because of the Past Resurrection and the Future Return of Christ, we know our present labour is not in vain (v 14; Titus 2:13-14; Psa 17:15).
