Sin blinds us to reality and to truth.

What is a "Gotcha" parable? Telling a story with an obvious answer that proves to be a self-condemning statement.

A vineyard is an OT image of the people of God. (Psalm 80; Isaiah 5)

What is the context of this parable?

Abusing the Prophets v 34-36

The Landowner had set them up in every possible way.

God, in the same way, has tended to Israel, He has tended to the church.

Israel had a poor record of receiving prophets and their message. (2 Chronicles 36:15-16; Acts 7:51-52; Matthew 23:37-38)

The current Jewish leadership is doing it again!

How does the landowner respond?

Killing the Son v 37-39

This parable was given in the week before the death of Jesus.

Why would they think to inherit the land?

The Gotcha v 40-41

What will He do to those vine-growers?

Applications

Jews; Reformation; Colleges; Denominations; Churches; Individuals.

Jesus Explains v 42-44

Christ is the chief cornerstone of the kingdom that God is building.

You have rejected him; judgment must come.

Don't reject Christ. Don't cast him off. Don't blur your vision to the truth.

Religious leaders React v 45-46

They understood the parable. Jesus was talking about them.

Repent or be crushed.

They feared the people, but they did not fear God.

Notice the seemingly endless patience of God.
