Holiness: Its Very Real Possibility

I Thessalonians 5.15-28

- 5.23: God is at work, sanctifying (making them holy) His children
- 5.24: He is faithful in this work
- 5.27: Believers are holy

Genuine Holiness is possible

- 1. All true believers are aware of their sinfulness, failings, and inadequacies.
- 2. We should also understand that while all sin IS sin against God, God Himself does not view all sin equally
 - A. The Law provided different punishments for different infractions. Not all sins demanded death
 - B. Numbers 15.29-31
 - C. Mat 10:15 Verily I say unto you, It shall be more tolerable for the land of Sodom and Gomorrha in the day of judgment, than for that city.

- 3. The point is, that we cannot see every sin as the same; and so refuse to fight any sin at all.
- 4. The fact that there is lust in our hearts does not excuse action upon that lust
- 5. The Bible demands that I recognize my sinfulness, but will not allow me to dwell upon that; to allow that to become an obstacle to growth and service.
- 6. God Himself recognizes the holiness of His people

- A. Gen 6:9 These are the generations of Noah: Noah was a just man and perfect in his generations, and Noah walked with God.
- B. Job 1:8 And the LORD said unto Satan, Hast thou considered my servant Job, that there is none like him in the earth, a <u>perfect and an upright</u> man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil?
- C. Luke 1:6 And they were both <u>righteous before</u> <u>God</u>, walking in all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blameless
- D. In other words, their "sinful humanity" existed side by side with their holiness.
- E. God is PLEASED when people put forth sincere effort to obey Him.
 - i. Isaiah 64.6. AND 5

- F. Rom 12:1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, <u>acceptable unto God</u>, which is your reasonable service.
- G. Rom 14:18 For he that in these things serveth Christ is <u>acceptable to God</u>, and approved of men.
- H. Col 1:10 That ye might walk worthy of the Lord <u>unto all pleasing</u>, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God;
- I. Col 3:20 Children, obey your parents in all things: for this is <u>well pleasing</u> unto the Lord.

- F. 1Th 2:4 But as we were allowed of God to be put in trust with the gospel, even so we speak; <u>not as</u> <u>pleasing men, but God</u>, which trieth our hearts.
- G. 1Ti 2:3 For this is <u>good and acceptable</u> in the sight of God our Saviour;
- H. 1Ti 5:4 But if any widow have children or nephews, let them learn first to shew piety at home, and to requite their parents: for that is <u>good and</u> <u>acceptable</u> before God.
- I. Heb 13:16 But to do good and to communicate forget not: for with such sacrifices <u>God is well</u> <u>pleased.</u>
- J. 1Jn 3:22 And whatsoever we ask, we receive of him, because we keep his commandments, and do those things that are <u>pleasing in his sight</u>.

- 7. God does not view our sincere efforts with suspicion.
 - A. He is our Father, and we are His children.
 - B. What good parent despises the sincere effort of their child?
