INFANT BAPTISM: THE RESPONSIBILITY

- I. The idea.
 - A. Children are included with their believing parent in the covenant and church of God.
 - B. There is a great responsibility implied in infant baptism: the demand of the covenant.
 - 1. The Form for Baptism makes this responsibility clear: "Whereas in all covenant there are contained two parts, ..."
 - 2. The concept of infant baptism would be destroyed if we do not include the responsibility.
- II. We focus on the responsibility (the demand of the covenant) of the parents.
 - A. It is NOT to save them. Only God is able and can save by opening a heart.
 - B. It is to bring up their child, to the utmost of their power, in the doctrines of salvation taught here.
 - 1. It is to rear our children in the truth of Scripture concerning God's relationship to them and theirs to Him.
 - 2. God created the family as the most powerful agent for the instruction of the children.
 - C. The parents accept the primary responsibility of rearing their children.
- III. The purpose of all parental instruction is so our children learn how to live godly (to be God's people) in this world.
 - A. There is urgency, for they must.
 - B. Parental demands and Christian discipline go together.
 - C. An effect of our teaching is that some of our children may grow up showing themselves to be ungodly.
