Lesson D13: Living in Kingdom Community

Matthew 18:15-20; 1 Corinthians 6:1-8

- I. CALLED TO COMMUNITY (15)—Holiness is relational.
 - A. <u>Created for Community</u> (Gen 2:18)—CREATION

Humans were not created for solitary relationship with God.

B. Disruption of Relationships (Gen 3)—FALL

Sin disrupted not only relationship with God, but also with one another.

C. Restoration of Fellowship (Rev)—REDEMPTION

The coming kingdom of God will bring the restoration of human community.

- II. RESPONSIBILITY OF THE INDIVIDUAL (15; Lev 19:17)
 - A. <u>Be Honest</u> (Eph 4:25)—Don't live in denial; be honest with yourself.
 - B. Speak Up (Lev 19:17-18; Eph 4:26-27)—Hidden, unacknowledged anger leads to sin.
 - 1. <u>To the Offender</u>—first, not to everyone else.
 - 2. <u>In Private</u> (Prov 17:9)—in order to protect his reputation and keep damages to a minimum.
 - C. <u>Pursue Relationship</u> (Gen 3:8-9)—Seek out the offender to save the relationship
 - 1. <u>The Isolating Effect of Offense</u>—shame and fear compel us to withdraw from the person we have wronged.
 - 2. The Pursuing Grace of God (Rom 5:6-10; 1 Pet 3:11) God initiated conversation.
- III. INVOLVEMENT OF THE COMMUNITY (16)
 - A. <u>Public Concern for Private Relationships</u> (1 Cor 12:26)—The way members of the church relate to one another affects the entire community.

- 1. Health of the Church Body (1 Cor 12:26)
- 2. Beauty of the Church's Witness (Jn 3:35)
- B. <u>The Ministry of Mediators</u>—without a vested interest in the case except in bringing about repentance and restoration for the sake of peace.
 - 1. Provide Perspective—see things you don't
 - 2. <u>Assist Communication</u>—help both sides understand each other
- C. <u>The Role of Witnesses</u> (Deut 19:15; 2 Cor 13:1; 1 Tim 5:19)—stand with you before the church
 - 1. Establishing Truth
 - 2. <u>Protecting Both Parties</u>
- IV. <u>JURISDICTION OF THE CHURCH</u> (17-20; 1 Tim 5:19-21)—We are citizens of Christ's kingdom and are held to the standards of His kingdom.
 - A. Over Its Members (1 Cor 6:1-6)—not civil society at large
 - **B.** <u>Spiritual Authority</u>—binding and loosing is witnessed and ratified by heaven
 An offense between Christians is a spiritual *matter* and must be handled in a spiritual *manner*.
 - 1. To Censure—to withhold the sacraments and to excommunicate
 - 2. <u>To Allow</u>—to admit to membership and to restore membership and benefits.
 - C. Corporate Authority (19-20)—not in the hands of only one person
 - 1. <u>Decided in agreement</u>—one angry person can't decide this on a whim
 - 2. Conducted prayerfully—asking God to do it

Must be done according to His will, honoring His character, in the interest of His kingdom

3. In the <u>Presence of Jesus</u> (Ezekiel 34; Jn 9:35-35)

Not the *number* of people gathered but the *identity* and *purpose* of the gathering.
